Bradley statement on Republicans defeating attempts to weaken state's anti-discrimination laws

CONCORD, NH -- Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro), issued the following statement today following the defeat of SB 298 and SB 304:

“Across New Hampshire, parents are making their concerns known regarding what is being taught in their children’s classrooms as well as the positive changes they believe will make the educational experience better and more transparent. Republicans listened. Today, our students cannot be taught that one group of people are inherently inferior or superior by the virtue of their immutable characteristics. Our public employers can conduct bias training in their workplaces and educators have the academic freedom to teach history of our state and nation without interference. By making these changes, we actually strengthened New Hampshire’s anti-discrimination laws. Attempts to turn them back are misguided. SB 298 and SB 304 would have done just that, so I am pleased both pieces of legislation were defeated.”
