## **Senate unanimously passes final phase of \$109M Property Taxpayer Relief Package**

CONCORD, NH – The Senate unanimously passed the fourth stage of its Property Taxpayer Relief Package today, approving \$67M in additional funding to cities and towns to help working families deal with rising costs.

Major pieces of the Property Taxpayer Relief (PTR) plan include:

	Municipal Bridge Projects	36M
	Doubling body-worn and dashboard camera fund	1M

SB 420	Extraordinary Needs Grants for New Hampshire schools	24.3M
HB 398	State funding for wastewater projects	12.65M
SB 412	Increase in nursing home reimbursement rates	5 M

**Grand TOTAL** **\$109M**

Majority Leader Jeb Bradley said, “The Senate is proud to approve \$109M going back to our cities and towns under our Property Taxpayer Relief Package. With inflation at a 40-year high, and state revenues coming in far greater than anticipated, all New Hampshire taxpayers can and should benefit from a surplus that is a direct result of responsible tax and budget policies.”
