Sen. Carson statement on public safety benefits of SB 292

Bill requires parole/probation officers to be notified when a parolee is arrested

CONCORD, NH – Sen. Sharon Carson (R-Londonderry) Chair of the Judiciary Committee, issued the following statement regarding bi-partisan Senate Bill 292:

"SB 229 is all about common sense and keeping our communities safe. It requires that parole or probation officers be notified whenever one of their clients has been arrested and is being detained. The county correctional facility where a detainee is being held will be responsible for the notification. Parole and probation violations constitute real public safety issues, and when they occur, the proper alerts need to be in place. This legislation makes the notification process clearer which will benefit everyone and promote increased protection for citizens and the communities where they live."
