AN ACT requiring town and city clerks to distribute a list of crisis pregnancy centers to persons issued a marriage certificate.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

Marriage Certificates; List of Family Planning Services and Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Amend
RSA 457:28-a to read as follows:

457:28-a List of Family Planning Services. The town clerk shall distribute with each certificate issued to couples under the provisions of RSA 457:26, a list of family planning agencies, *crisis pregnancy centers*, and services that are available to them in the state of New Hampshire. The [bureau,-maternal and child health,] *department* of [the] health and human services [department] shall supply each town clerk with sufficient quantity of the list initially, copies of the list to be resupplied upon the request of the town clerk.

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2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Constituent request. Presently, town clerks have to provide family planning info when issuing a marriage license. In interest of equal access, this bill would add the crisis pregnancy centers. Not a large cost for Department of Health & Human Services. Will allow for fully informed citizens. Feels the current information is not complete.

Karen Testerman, Cornerstone Policy Research

Favors the bill. Believe it helps to give a complete picture of reproductive rights. Both sides of picture given. They provide information to women in crisis situation. Provide some services. Volunteers in centers are trained.

Jennifer Frizzell, Planned Parenthood

In 1970's, joint initiation (Federal and State) to disperse information on family planning. Doesn't oppose, but has concerns. Crisis centers do not offer all the planning options. Family Planning has oversight from State to meet state goals. Crisis centers are not medical centers; they are counseling centers. Family Planning centers meet many goals of state – medical information, child spacing, raising birth weight, etc. State framework for Family Planning Centers.

Claire Ebel, NHCLU

Some legal concerns about this legislation. The agencies listed in brochures the State hands out are regulated by the state. The Crisis Pregnancy Centers are not regulated and the State may be set up for litigation. There is a cost related to this – needs a fiscal note.

Adding this amendment to this statute violates the statute itself. This statute deals with family planning, not just pregnancy. NHCLU supports right to choose, but the legal aspects of this bill are important.

HB 273

The application process for a marriage license is outlined in RSA 457:23. There are brochures that provide information about family planning agencies, fetal alcohol syndrome and human immunodeficiency virus that the town clerk must give to each couple who applies for a marriage license. This bill would have required a brochure listing crisis pregnancy centers be included in that packet of information provided by the department of health and human services and made available to couples through the town clerk. The crisis pregnancy centers are not regulated by the State and therefor this information could not be easily verified or accessible to the department. Another bill, HB 311, addresses the issue by eliminating the brochure about the family planning agencies and the committee felt that this was a better way to keep the town clerks out of individual couples decisions.

HB311

This bill repeals the requirement found in RSA 457:28-a that the town clerk must distribute family planning services lists to marriage license applicants and the couple has to sign an affidavit acknowledging that they received and discussed the brochure regarding family planning services. The sponsor did not want to eliminate the other two brochures about fetal alcohol syndrome and human immunodeficiency virus that are also required to be handed out to applicants. The committee felt that it was an important step towards keeping the town clerk and government out of individual couples decisions and therefore voted the bill Ought to Pass.
