

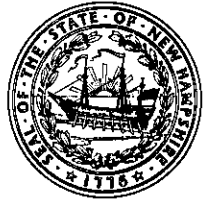

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on HB 1153 which would add a representative of Granite State Rural Water Association (GSRWA) to the existing Commission to Study Water Infrastructure Sustainability Funding (Infrastructure Sustainability Commission) that was established in 2009. The Department of Environmental Services (DES) supports this bill.

In 2009, in recognition of the importance of water to New Hampshire's economic well being and quality of life, the Infrastructure Sustainability Commission was established by enactment of SB 60 into law to study the long term needs and methods to support New Hampshire's programs and environmental infrastructure that serve to protect, manage, and maintain significant surface and ground water resources. This commission includes a variety of diverse stakeholders with interests in water related infrastructure and programs and is scheduled to conclude its work report findings to the Legislature in November 2010.

The GSRWA is a professional organization with members who are operators of small rural water and wastewater systems from across New Hampshire. GSRWA would offer the unique and important perspective of these small rural systems as the Infrastructure Sustainability Commission evaluates needs and possible funding solutions. GSRWA representatives have attended many of the Commission meetings as observers and have already contributed to the Commission's discussions on infrastructure needs. Membership on the Infrastructure Sustainability Commission would formalize and elevate the GSRWA role as the Commission moves forward to complete its work this year.

Good Morning,

I am Representative Karen Umberger and I represent Carroll County District 1. I am here today to introduce HB 1153 an act relative to membership of the commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

Last year SB 60 introduced by Senator Martha Fuller Clark which was an act establishing a commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding was passed by both the Senate and the House and included representatives from numerous organizations. However, left off the list of representatives was an organization that represents over 200 small rural water systems, Granite State Rural Water Association. When I learned of this oversight, I contacted Senator Martha Fuller-Clark to determine if a representative from this organization could be appointed to the committee. Unfortunately, this was not possible. She did recommend that a bill be introduced in the 2010 session to add Granite State Rural Water Association to the commission and agreed a representative could attend and participate during the meetings. Granite State Rural Water Association appointed a person and he has been attending the meetings. HB 1153 simply adds Granite State Rural Water Association to the membership of the Commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Nine*

AN ACT establishing a commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1 Commission Established. There is established a commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

## 2 Membership and Compensation.

### I. The members of the commission shall be as follows:

- (a) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
- (b) Three members of the house of representatives, including at least one member of the resources, recreation and development committee, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- (c) The commissioner of the department of environmental services, or designee.
- (d) A representative of the New Hampshire Public Works Association who is employed by a municipality, appointed by the president of the board of directors of that association.
- (e) A representative of the New Hampshire Water Works Association, appointed by the president of the board of directors of that association.
- (f) A representative of the New Hampshire Water Pollution Control Association, appointed by the president of the board of directors of that association.
- (g) A representative of the New Hampshire Local Government Center, appointed by that organization.
- (h) A representative of the New Hampshire Association of Regional Planning Commissions, appointed by that organization.
- (i) A representative of the American Council of Engineering Companies of New Hampshire, appointed by that organization.
- (j) A representative of the Business and Industry Association of New Hampshire, appointed by that organization.
- (k) A representative of the New Hampshire Rivers Council, appointed by that organization.
- (l) A representative of the New Hampshire Lakes Association, appointed by that organization.
- (m) A representative of the Piscataqua Region Estuaries Partnership, appointed by the director.
- (n) A member of the U.S. Geological Survey, appointed by the regional director of the Northeast Area.
- (o) A representative of the Granite State Hydropower Association, Inc., appointed by that organization.

### II. Members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the commission.

3 Duties. The commission's review shall include, but not be limited to, an assessment of the state's need to construct and maintain infrastructure to protect its water resources, taking into consideration public health issues, ecosystem and habitat protection, and economic factors including tourism. The commission shall consider the information, conclusions, and recommendations presented in the New Hampshire water resources primer published in December 2008, which evaluates how to improve the long-term sustainability of New Hampshire's water infrastructure and its funding.

4 Chairperson. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the senate member. The first meeting of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section.

5 Report. The commission shall make an interim report on or before November 1, 2009, with a final report of its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2010.

6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

### STATEMENT OF INTENT

HB 1153 will add one new member, representing the granite state rural water association, to the commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding. The granite state rural water association is comprised of over 200 small water systems in the state. The amendment rectifies an error in citation. This bill is supported by the department of environmental services (DES).
