ANALYSIS

This bill enables cities and towns to adopt and offer higher education scholarships for high school pupils to any high school pupil who graduates high school early and who achieves a score in the "proficient" range or above on all subjects tested in the statewide assessment. The scholarship would be equivalent to 1/2 of the total per pupil expenditure for high school pupils in such city or town to be used to defray tuition costs at any public or private institution of higher education within or outside of New Hampshire

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 New Subdivision; Higher Education Scholarships for High School Pupils. Amend RSA 198 by 2 inserting after section 61 the following new subdivision:

Higher Education Scholarships for High School Pupils

198:62 Higher Education Scholarships for High School Pupils. Upon adoption of this subdivision in a city or town, a pupil who graduates from high school prior to his or her scheduled graduation date, and who achieves a score in the "proficient" range or above in all subjects tested in the statewide assessments, shall receive from the city or town in which he or she resides, a scholarship equal to 1/2 of the total per pupil expenditure for high school pupils in such city or town for the purpose of defraying tuition costs at any public or private institution of higher education within or outside of New Hampshire.

198:63 Procedure for Adoption.

- I. Any town or city may adopt the provisions of RSA 198:62 in the following manner:
- (a) In a town, other than a town that has adopted a charter pursuant to RSA 49-D, the question shall be placed on the warrant of a special or annual town meeting, by the governing body or by petition pursuant to RSA 39:3.
- (b) In a city or town that has adopted a charter pursuant to RSA 49-C or RSA 49-D, the legislative body may consider and act upon the question in accordance with its normal procedures for passage of resolutions, ordinances, and other legislation. In the alternative, the legislative body of such municipality may vote to place the question on the official ballot for any regular municipal election.
- II. The vote shall include the provisions of RSA 198:62. If a majority of those voting on the question vote "yes," RSA 198:62 shall take effect within the town or city, on the date set by the governing body, or July 1 following its adoption, whichever shall occur first.
- III. A town or city may modify, if applicable, or rescind the provisions of RSA 198:62 in the manner described in this section.
- IV. An amendment to RSA 198:62 related to the amount of the scholarship or eligibility for the scholarship, shall apply in a town or city which previously adopted the provision only after the town or city complies with the procedure in this section, unless otherwise expressly required by law.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Rep. Daniels, sponsor, introduced the bill and spoke in favor. Discussed possible language changes. Feels this would get parents more involved and give incentives for that. Feels this is a win-win situation and is used in Utah, Arizona and Kentucky.

Rep. Cooney: Would this cover an extra year, as a prep school or Granite Scholars. Ans.-Intent was to make this for public school, if that needs to be added, that's fine. Not sure if prep school is higher education.

Rep. Osborne: Kids that do the best in school have very involved parents. This would be using public money to cover families that can probably afford to do this. Why wasn't this need based. Ans.-I didn't feel that I should differentiate. Even kids from affluent families may have parents who say, after high school, you're on your own. Also, someone who can afford college for one year may find it difficult to pay the next, perhaps lost a job that they once held.

Rep. Laliberte: How are you expecting to pay for this. Ans.-Out of the school district's budget.

Rep. Soucy: Public schools are paid by taxpayers. Home schoolers get no funding and charter schools partly funded. How would they qualify for this? Ans.-In the groups that you are talking about, they are all paying their taxes. Home schoolers would not qualify unless they take the State Assessment Tests.

Perhaps the committee would want to make an exception. I would not be opposed to that.

Rep. Soucy: Would that mean that property taxes would increase. Ans.- I was on the school board for six years - we always had an excess.

Rep. Lewis: Would it not be good to advise first year students that this could be available.

Rep. Gagnon: It seems this bill should rightfully go to Education Committee. Also, my town of Claremont has a program where students that excel can already take classes at Dartmouth while in high school.

Rep. Brown: Do I understand that this could take money from my town and be paid to a religious institution out of state. Ans.-I guess that could happen, but the money goes to the student who can spend it as he needs.

Rep. Daniels would be glad to amend bill as needed to suit to a more proper designation.
