Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Electricians Fees; Transfer to General Fund. Amend RSA 21-P:12-d to read as follows:

21-P:12-d Fire Standards and Training and Emergency Medical Services Fund. There is established in the office of the state treasurer a separate, nonlapsing fund to be known as the fire standards and training and emergency medical services fund from which the state treasurer shall pay expenses incurred in the administration of the division of fire standards and training and emergency medical services, under RSA 21-P:12-a, the division of fire safety, under RSA 21-P:12, the division of homeland security and emergency management, and the position of fireworks inspector, under RSA 160-C:17. If the expenditure of additional funds over budget estimates is necessary for the proper functioning of the division of fire standards and training and emergency medical services. the division of fire safety, or the division of homeland security and emergency management, the department of safety may request, with prior approval of the fiscal committee of the general court, the transfer of funds from the fire standards and training and emergency medical services funds to the department of safety for such purposes. 



HB 168 FISCAL NOTE

AN ACT relative to disposition of electricians' fees.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of Safety states this bill <u>as amended by the House</u> (Amendment # 2009-0157h), will decrease state restricted revenue and expenditures and increase state general fund revenue and expenditures by an indeterminable amount in FY 2010 and each year thereafter. This bill will have no fiscal impact on county and local revenues or expenditures.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill transfers electrician's fee revenue and expenditure to the general fund and repeals certain distributions of electrician's fees to the fire standards and

training and emergency medical services fund. Although the proposed legislation is expected to be aggregately revenue and expenditure neutral; the Department of Safety states the proposed legislation will redirect fees collected by the Electrician's Board from the fire standards and training and emergency medical services fund to the general fund as well as changes the source of funding for the Electrician's Board from the fire standards and training and emergency medical services fund to the general fund.

This bill does not contain an appropriation.

Talking points

HB 168 adds language to NH law that is not needed as this already exist in NH RSA 319-C:6-b that directs where the fees shall be deposited that collected by the Bureau of Electrical Safety and Licensing under the State Fire Marshal's Office.

RSA 319-C:6-b specifically states "Fees collected in excess of actual operating expenses shall be deposited in the general fund as unrestricted revenue."

What should really be happening is reductions in bureaucracy by consolidation within the division to have the fees collected go directly into the fire fund for the electrician's budget and stay there. This would reduce the time spent by accounting personnel moving funds from one location to another.

There are checks and balances for the legislature to monitor to insure that the state does not collect excessive fees for an electrician's license. The fees are set through rule making. The fees collected are presently undergoing an audit by the LBA and it will show that there are not excess funds. The audit will also show compliance with RSA 319-C:6-b sending the excess funds collected to the general fund.

HB 656 relative to collection of the education property tax.

This bill takes the money now used for the low and moderate income property tax relief program and redistributes it by a new formula to those whose state and local education portions of the property tax on the first one hundred thousand dollars of the value of their home exceeds 10% of their income. It also partially moves the collection of the statewide property tax from the towns to the department of revenue administration, and replaces the float the towns now receive to administer this program with a flat fifty cent payment. Start-up costs of the change are likely to be considerable, and these and operating costs are not provided to the department, although the float will later become available for appropriation. After several iterations, the bill still has fatal technical defects. In the view of the majority, it will not provide meaningful tax relief to any more low-income citizens than the current system does, and in fact, because of the difficulty of publicizing it to the right people, may provide less. We want the chance to remedy these defects in interim study.

HB 597 revising the property tax relief system

This bill turns the current low and moderate income property tax relief program into a rebate program for any state-level education property tax that exceeds 1% of the taxpayer's income. The sponsor brought in several last-minute amendments and the committee would like the opportunity to include his work with the interim study of HB 656.
