326

AN ACT relative to certain extensions for temporary plates.

SPONSORS: Sen. Fuller Clark, Dist 24

COMMITTEE: Transportation and Interstate Cooperation

ANALYSIS

This bill authorizes the director of the division of motor vehicles to extend the validity period of temporary plates for persons with walking disabilities requiring modifications to the vehicle.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT relative to certain extensions for temporary plates.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Temporary Permits and Plates Pending Registration. Amend RSA 261:56 to read as follows:

2 261:56 Temporary Permit and Plates Pending Registration.

3 *I.* In compliance with the rules of the department, a dealer may issue temporary plates
4 furnished by the department for use of any vehicle, including mopeds, sold by ~~[them]~~ *it*. Any such
5 vehicle may be driven displaying temporary plates until the customary registration certificate and
6 plates have been received by the owner but, ~~[in no case shall it]~~ ***except as provided in paragraph***
7 ***II, the vehicle shall not*** be driven under temporary plates for a period in excess of 20 days from the
8 date of issuance by the dealer.

9 *II.* ***If the owner has a walking disability as defined in RSA 261:88 and requires***
10 ***additional time to equip the vehicle to accommodate his or her disability, the owner shall***
11 ***submit a request on a form provided by the department setting forth the type of***
12 ***modification that is being made to the vehicle, the business or other person making the***
13 ***modification, and the estimated completion time for the modification, and the director***

8 *reasonable extension of the expiration date to enable the modifications to be completed.*




