HOUSE BILL **1139**

AN ACT relative to the regulation of podiatrists by the board of podiatry.

SPONSORS: Rep. DeJoie, Merr 11

COMMITTEE: Executive Departments and Administration

ANALYSIS

This bill makes various changes to the regulation of podiatrists and the administration of the board of podiatry.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Ten

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Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 Podiatry; Examination Requirement. Amend RSA 315:2, I to read as follows:
- 2 I. Any person admitted to practice podiatry in this state shall be required to pass an
3 examination [~~before the board~~] **given by the National Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners.**
4 The person shall be of good professional character and at least 18 years of age. The person shall
5 have graduated from a college of podiatry or podiatry medicine which is accredited by the American
6 Podiatric Medical Association, and maintaining at that time a standard satisfactory to the board. No
7 person who is not licensed as a podiatrist as provided by RSA 315:8 shall practice or attempt to
8 practice podiatry in the state or call oneself or allow oneself to be called a "podiatrist" or a "podiatric
9 surgeon" or designate or describe the person's occupation by the use of any words or letters to lead
10 others to believe that the person is so licensed.
- 11 2 Compensation of Board. RSA 315:3 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- 12 315:3 Compensation. The members of the board shall receive per diem compensation of \$50 for
13 meetings and other board activities requiring 2 or more hours in a 24-hour period, and shall be
14 reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in connection with the work of the board.
- 15 3 Examinations. Amend RSA 315:7 to read as follows:
- 16 315:7 Examinations. Successful passage of the National Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners
17 test parts [~~1 and 2 as well as PM-Lexis~~] **I, II, and III** is required. The board shall keep a record of
18 examination results.
- 19 4 License Renewal. RSA 315:11 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- 20 315:11 License Renewal. Every person licensed to practice under this chapter shall apply to the
21 board on a biennial basis for renewal of license on forms provided by the board and shall pay a
22 renewal fee as established in rules of the board. If a person applies to the board for renewal of
23 license by June 30 of the year in which the licensee's renewal is set to occur, the license shall not
24 expire until the board has taken final action on the application for renewal. At least 20 days prior to
25 the expiration of any license, the board shall cause a notice to be mailed to the licensee advising him
26 or her of the expiration date and enclosing a blank renewal application form.
- 27 5 Neglect to Renew; Reinstatement. RSA 315:12 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- 28 315:12 Neglect to Renew. Any licensee who fails to renew his or her license by June 30 of the
29 year in which the licensee's renewal is set to occur, shall be required to pay double the renewal fee if
30 paid within 90 days of the expiration date. Any failure, neglect, or refusal on the part of any person

1 automatically result in the lapse of the license. Licenses lapsed under this section for nonpayment
2 within 90 days shall not be reinstated except upon payment of a reinstatement fee as established in
3 rules adopted by the board, and a showing of such evidence of professional competence as the board
4 may reasonably require.

5 6 Notice of Expiration. Amend RSA 315:13 to read as follows:

6 315:13 Notice of Expiration. The secretary shall ~~also~~ mail a notice to each holder of a license
7 that has not been renewed *within 90 days of the expiration date*, advising him *or her* of the
8 expiration of ~~his~~ *the* license and the penalty of practicing podiatry without holding a license and
9 the condition and terms upon which his *or her* license may be ~~revived and renewed~~ *reinstated*.

10 7 New Section; Reinstatement. Amend RSA 315 by inserting after section 13 the following new
11 section:

12 315:13-a Reinstatement. Any person who has not renewed his or her license within 90 days of
13 the expiration date shall only have his or her license restored upon the filing of a reinstatement
14 application, accompanied by the reinstatement fee as established by the board, proof of satisfaction
15 of continuing podiatric education requirements established by RSA 315:2, II, and such other evidence
16 of professional competence as the board may reasonably require.

17 8 Repeal. The following are repealed:

18 I. RSA 315:8, IV, relative to expiration and renewal of annual licenses.

19 II. RSA 315:14, relative to list of licensees.

20 9 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

What the bill does:

This bill makes various changes to the regulation of podiatrists and the administration of the board of podiatry.

Summary of testimony received:

Representative Harding, House ED&A Committee

- This bill clarifies that the exam required to practice podiatry in NH will be a proctored exam given by the National Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners.

- This clarifies that a notice will be issued within 90 days of the expiration date of a license advising the license holder of the penalty of practicing podiatry without a license and the condition and terms upon which his or her license may be reinstated.
- This also allows the Board to address continuing education requirements.

Penny Taylor, Board of Podiatry; Jean Barnes, DHHS/Boards

- This changes the Board compensation from \$5 to \$50 which is consistent with other regulatory boards. About 75% of the regulatory boards are compensated. The money is in the budget (class 50) so the fees will not have to go up. This board meets quarterly.
- There are currently no national continuing education standards, but the NH rules do have continuing education requirements based on what other states do. The standards were recently increased.

The Senate Committee on Executive Departments and Administration held a hearing on the following:

The Chair, Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, opened the hearing on HB 1139 and invited Representative Laurie Harding to introduce the legislation.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: I'll open up the hearing on House Bill 1139 and recognize the chair of the House ED&A Committee, Representative Harding, to introduce the bill.

Representative Laurie Harding: Thank you, Madam Chair. Good afternoon. For the record, my name's Laurie Harding and I represent Grafton 11, which is Lebanon.

And I think Ken Hawkins was down here earlier to do our bills, so I'm glad I walked in when I did, because I know he had a conflicting meeting.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: He did.

Representative Harding: So I'm pleased to be introducing House Bill 1139, relative to the regulation of podiatrists by the Board of Podiatry. This bill came out of our committee with a vote of 17-0. There was two separate fairly quick subcommittee work sessions on this bill, to really fine tune the language.

The bill primarily is housekeeping. It specifies the name of the exam that will be given for podiatric medicine. It adds the word proctored to the

National Board Medical Examiner language in line 16. That's something we're trying to do with all of the licensing bills that come through. You'll see on page 2 that it speaks to an expiring license and speaks to renewal within 90 days.

And then lastly, it adds some language so that the Board can write language having to do with continuing education.

This Board is underneath... That's it. Do you have any questions? I believe there are some folks here ...

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: I've got a couple. We've been trying to work together on these types of issues over the last couple of years. So I was just trying to double check those things that we're trying to be uniform about. For example, on line 30 of page 1, upon the request of a person licensed, if they have to go and serve ...

Representative Harding: Right.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: ... their license is placed on inactive status and may be reactivated after notification to the Board within one year of the person's release from active status by payment of the renewal fee and with proof of completion of the most current continuing education requirements, unless within the renewal period. So that's consistent. One of the things we said is, if there's an exam or there are continuing eds or whatever else, we can't just say somebody can be gone for a period of time and then not have to meet any of those requirements.

Representative Harding: Right.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Because it sort of says something about our belief that those requirements are necessary, doesn't it?

Representative Harding: That's correct.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: So that's consistent with what we've done on the others.

Representative Laurie Harding: Yeah. And the language regarding proctoring and also making sure that there's ...

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: And where is that again. Oh, this is ...

Representative Harding: That's on page 1, line 16. And then also making sure that there is a provision for continuing education. And that's on page 2, on line 28.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: So you're not putting that in statute. You're going to allow that to go into rulemaking.

Representative Harding: Yes, and that's fairly common, for boards to be able to, they need to be able to clarify exactly what they're going to do for continuing education.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: But typically in the statute it would say, need, you know, either number of hours or the credits.

Representative Harding: Podiatric, I don't believe that podiatric medicine has those kinds of national requirements that organizations do. For example, nursing assistants have a national requirement that they have 12 units a year of continuing education.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Right, and usually that's what I see in statute.

Representative Harding: Right.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Either the continuing, the units or the time.

Representative Harding: Right, right. But in this case, because it's not driven by a national entity, I don't believe that they have said, other than putting it in rule that there's no need for it to be specific here.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Okay. Are there other questions? Representative Harding, thank you very much. This looks, and I just read the House blurb, and it does indeed say that it's housekeeping. It looked more formidable than that, and I wasn't sure what had changed from the original statute, not having gotten back to it yet. So good.

Representative Harding: Good. I'll hang around for a few minutes just in case.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Okay. And so, Penny Taylor.

Ms. Jean Barnes: And Jean Barnes.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Absolutely, that's great. Anytime you're ready, sorry.

Ms. Penny Taylor: Good afternoon, that's okay. For the record, I'm Penny Taylor, I'm the administrator for the Board of Podiatry. I'm just here to say the Board is in support of this bill and if you have any questions, I'd be happy to answer them.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Okay. Any questions for Ms. Taylor?
Senator Carson.

Senator Sharon M. Carson, D. 14: Thank you. I'm looking at page 1 under compensation, and I've also read the blurb from the House where it said that they're going, that they raised the per diem compensation. How much was it raised?

Ms. Taylor: It was from \$5 to \$50.

Senator Sharon M. Carson, D. 14: \$5 to \$50, okay.

Ms. Taylor: Our board members, at the present time, as they come don't even want the check for \$5 so we don't even submit per diem. Because by the time they get it, it's \$2 and something. We're trying to make them consistent with the other boards.

Senator Sharon M. Carson, D. 14: Okay.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: And it's interesting that you say that, because I was going to ask Jean that question. So many committees and commissions that we see, you know, established don't receive any compensation for the time that they serve. So are you suggesting that most or all of the boards, these are regulatory boards that we're talking about. Okay, I thought I saw you going like this. So these are regulatory boards and do all board members receive compensation?

Ms. Barnes: I can say of the 21 boards that I have, well, I won't even go through them. But I would say 75 percent, yes.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Wouldn't we want them all to be consistent?

Ms. Jean Barnes: Yes. And I think once, this board would be part of the consolidation if Senate Bill 499 passes. And once, if, I should say once the

board consolidation, then we can look at all of those things and try to make, I would like to try to make everything as equal as I can.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Okay.

Ms. Barnes: I mean, Allied Health right now has six or seven boards under them and I believe they have \$50. Is Dental \$50?

Ms. Taylor: I'm not sure.

Ms. Barnes: I have all that in my office if you want to see it. But there would be some consistency once these smaller boards were consolidated. This is one of them.

Ms. Taylor: I have three other boards besides the Board of Medicine. They all get \$50.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Okay.

Ms. Taylor: And those will be part of the consolidation, if it passes.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Well, takes you out for a nice lunch. Okay. Other questions?

Ms. Barnes: I should also tell you that the money is in the budget.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, thank you.

Ms. Barnes: And they will not have to raise their fees. They have money in Class 50 already for their \$5 and it's budgeted, so this \$45 is really not going to be that much, affected by it. Because it's also in there in case they need help or they have hearings. **See written submission from Jean Barnes attached hereto and hereafter referred to as Attachment 1.**

Ms. Taylor: And they meet quarterly, they don't meet monthly. There's five of them, so they meet four times a year.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, okay.

Ms. Barnes: So there's plenty of money in the budget. And there's also plenty of money...

Representative Laurie Harding: Don't say that too loudly.

Ms. Taylor: I think they already took it for this year.

Ms. Barnes: They already took it for this year, but I don't think we took it for next year.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Senator DeVries.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Thank you, Madam Chair. I'm sure that you heard the question that our chair offered in reference to continuing education. And I note that the examination is a National Board of Podiatric, am I saying that right? Medical Examiners. So there is a national association of some level for the test?

Ms. Taylor: Yes.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: But no standards for continuing education, is that what I understand.

Ms. Taylor: That correct. We do have it in our rules already, but we noticed when this went through the last hearing, that there was nothing in the law that mentioned continuing ed. But we have a whole section of continuing ed in our rules.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Follow-up question if I might?

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Uhuh.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: How have you, do you review your continuing ed requirements with that of other states to decide if we are less lenient or more lenient on our podiatrists?


Ms. Taylor: Yeah, the Boards actually go to meetings that meet with other boards around the states and compare what we require to what they require. We actually just upped the amount last year or the year before, of hours that they get every two years.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Very well, thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Any further questions? Alright, with that I'll close the hearing on House Bill 1139.
