The Chair, Senator Martha Fuller Clark, opened the hearing on House Bill 1153 and invited the prime sponsor, Representative Karen Umberger, to introduce the legislation.

Representative Karen Umberger: Good morning, Madam Chairman and...

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Good morning. Welcome to our Committee. Glad to have you.

Representative Umberger: Thank you ... And members of the Energy, Environment, and Economic Development Committee. I'm Representative Karen Umberger, and I represent Carroll County District 1. I'm here today to introduce to the Committee HB 1153, which is an act relative to the membership of the commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

Last year, SB 60 - introduced by your Chairman - an act establishing a commission to study water infrastructure and sustainability was passed by both the Senate and the House and included representatives from numerous organizations throughout the state. However, left off the list of

representatives was an organization that represents over 200 small, rural water systems: Granite State Rural Water Association.

When I learned of this oversight, I contacted the Senator Fuller Clark to determine if it was a representative from this organization could be appointed to the committee. Unfortunately, this was not possible, and she recommended that a bill be introduced in the 2010 session to add Granite State Rural Water Association to the commission. She did indicate a representative could attend and participate during the meetings. Granite State Rural Water Association appointed David Bernier, the Superintendent of the North Conway Water Precinct, as their representative. He has been attending and participating in the meetings. HB 1153 simply officially adds Granite State Rural Water Association to the membership of the commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding.

Senator Amanda Merrill, D. 21: But I don't know. I must be missing a synapse this morning or something, but I can't see what ... It looks the same to me. Do you know if this...?

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: And the amendment corrected it to Chapter.

Senator Amanda Merrill, D. 21: Okay. Thank you.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Okay.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Then, we're going to need to change it.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Why?

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Because chaptered studies go out of existence, according to House rules and the Senate Bill we passed this year,

on the odd years or the even years. Has to be a statutory commission, but we can talk about that in Exec Session.

Representative Umberger: Oh.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Well, this is going to go out of existence by the end of this year.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, well then, we're fine.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: I don't believe that that's a problem.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, okay. Well, fine.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: No, what we're doing here is simply adding an additional member officially so that that member can vote. Okay?

Representative Umberger: Thank you.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Thank you. I have some other individuals here. I'd like to call upon David Bernier. Welcome.

<u>David Bernier, Granite State Rural Water Association</u>: Good morning, Senator.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Good morning.

Mr. Bernier: And I'll be very brief.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Good.

Mr. Bernier: As you know...

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: There is no opposition.

Mr. Bernier: I've been attending most of the meetings. I think I've only...

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Could you introduce yourself?

Mr. Bernier: ...missed one. My name is David Bernier. I'm the Superintendent for the North Conway Water Precinct, and I've been working and representing small systems for twenty-six-plus years. I was the Superintendent in Gorham, New Hampshire, for sixteen years, and then I was the Public Works Director in Dartmouth, Mass., in the south shore for

five years. And the last five and a half years, I've been the Superintendent for North Conway Water Precinct. And I'm also a Director for the Granite State Rural Water Association.

And I just ask that you support the bill. I'd like to be a voting member. I've been somewhat tight-lipped in the meetings only because I'm not a voting member, and I'd like to open up the opportunity to represent the small systems. And I'd like your support.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Thank you very much.

Mr. Bernier: Thank you.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Questions? I'd like to call upon Paul Whittemore.

<u>Paul Whittemore, Granite State Rural Water Association</u>: Good morning, Senator, Committee. I'm Paul Whittemore, and I represent Granite State Rural Water as a board member.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: And you will be brief?

Mr. Whittemore: I will be brief. My background: I worked for the Town of Derry, New Hampshire, for eleven years and went to Pembroke, New Hampshire, as a Superintendent for four years. I currently have my own backflow testing and repair business and get around to the small systems in New Hampshire to help them with some of their issues that they have.

We support this bill. It's important. The mission of Granite State Rural Water Association is to provide water and wastewater systems with professional technical assistance, training, and legislative representation. Rural water has supported public drinking water and wastewater systems and represented their interests for approximately twenty years. The Association has 265 members, ranging from municipal systems, mobile home parks, condominium associations, campgrounds, et cetera. And we bring a unique perspective, which is currently not represented on the commission.
