Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

24 Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law 104-191 (HIPAA) and regulations
25 promulgated thereunder by the United States Department of Health and Human Services (45 C.F.R.
26 Part 160 and Part 164). This shall include the requirement that all proposed releases of vital records
27 information to institutions and individuals both within and outside the department for the purposes
28 of health-related research be reviewed and approved by the [~~institutional review~~] board, under
29 RSA 126:24-e, before the requested information is released.

This bill changes the name of the institutional review board which conducts health-related research to the vital records privacy board for health-related research.

Summary of testimony received:

Rep. Flurey, Hills 16

- This bill changes the name of the institutional review board which conducts health-related research to the vital records privacy board for health-related research.

David Scanlan, Deputy Secretary of State

- The Institutional Review Board believes this name change is appropriate.

Lisabritt Solsky, DHHS

- DHHS requested this bill in order to achieve a technical correction to the name of NH's board for the release of Vital Records data for health related research.
- HIPAA privacy regulations created a responsibility for states to create a privacy board that would determine if and when requests for personal health information may be released for health research.
- Presently the NH Vital Records HIPAA privacy board is titled as an "Institutional Review Board" or IRB. However, this moniker is misleading and over time has created unnecessary and avoidable confusion.
- Traditional IRBs only exercise authority over information regarding living, identified persons and do not have authority to deny access to data.
- The vital records release Board reviews requests for vital records information relating to individuals both living and dead, and data that is both identified and de-identified. The standards employed by the Board in determining if information is released for health related purposes are outlined by HIPAA Privacy Regulations. As such, this board has a larger and distinguishable purview than that of a traditional IRB.
- Due to the present nomenclature employed for the Board it has been reported repeatedly by requestors of data that it was not clear that the Board has the authority and duty to deny access to data regarding deceased individuals or de-identified data if the request does not conform with HIPAA.
- By renaming the Board the "Vital Records Privacy Board" the confusion borne of the limited breadth of an IRB can be remedied.

The Chair, Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, opened the hearing on HB 1158 and invited Representative Joan Flurey to introduce the legislation.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Open the hearing on 1158 and this once again is a, I guess, we've scheduled all of Representative Pilotte's bills today and I am not seeing...

Representative Joan Flurey: I'm here for Representative Pilotte.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, I'm sorry, and ...

Representative Flurey: I'm Representative Flurey.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Another fabulous Ward 9 Representative.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh, okay, I missed, Representative Flurey, please come forward.

Representative Flurey: Thank you. This is much smaller than ED&A upstairs, I'll tell you. It makes it much homier.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Welcome to the Senate ED&A.

Representative Flurey: Thank you. For the record, I'm Joan Flurey, I represent District 16, Manchester's Ward 9. I'm here on behalf of Maurice Pilotte, who is in Israel. And his bill is changing the name of the Institutional Review Board to the Vital Records Privacy Board for Health Related Research. I would like to let you know that this went out of Committee 16-0.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: We have, as a matter of fact, the House Record that, 16-0, and it was on the consent calendar.

Representative Flurey: Yes.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Are there any questions for Representative Flurey?

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: It's actually the Vital Records Privacy Board, is that correct?

Representative Flurey: Is that what they call it, the Privacy Board?

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Uhum.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: The Department of Health and Human Services requests the Institutional Review Board be renamed the Vital Records Privacy Board.

Representative Flurey: Privacy Board, yes.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Okay, I just thought it was a little long the other way. Thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Any further questions? Thank you very much.

Representative Flurey: Thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: So I'm not sure who should go first, because we have Lisabritt here from... Well, we actually have all, we'll just go down the list. Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlan again, please.

Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlan: Thank you, Madam Chair, members of the Committee. David Scanlan, Deputy Secretary of State, and I'll be incredibly brief.

My understanding is that the, what we call the Institutional Review Board felt that the name the Vital Records Privacy Board for Health Related Research was a more accurate title for what they do. And we are in agreement with that and we would support this bill, and ask you to do the same thing.

I'd be happy to answer questions.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Senator DeVries.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Thank you, Madam Chair. And beyond stationery, would there be any additional costs that we should be concerned about?

Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan: Not that I'm aware. The one concern that we had with the name change, was it would impact in any way the responsibilities of that committee, and we don't believe that that would be the case.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: And that would be the reason, if I could follow-up.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Follow-up.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: That would be the reason that no fiscal note has been attached to the bill?

Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan: Yes.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Senator Fuller Clark.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: So my question is, David, is the official name – Vital Records Privacy Board for Health Related Research? Or is it the Vital Records Privacy Board? You want that tag line - for Health Related Research?

Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan: My understanding is that the official title would be the Vital Records Privacy Board for Health Related Research. I think that just in normal practice, the name's going to be shortened by the people that use it.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Okay, so there's not, there's not a problem. I just think it's a pretty long handle.

Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan: No, no. Again, this is a request by the actual, what used to be the Institutional Review Board. If they're happy with it, we're happy with it.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Okay, thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Thank you.

Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan: Thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Any further questions? Okay, thank you very much. Lisabritt Solsky. How are you?

Attorney Lisabritt Solsky: I'm well, thank you. How are you?

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Is this a first for ED&A?

Attorney Solsky: It may be.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Yeah, that's true actually, now that I think about it. I feel like I see you so often, but it's in JLCAR, right.

Attorney Solsky: Well, I was thinking to myself how unusual it is to come to a committee where all of the members sitting have concurrently served on JLCAR.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Yes.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: That's jail.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Yes, I was going to say, there's something that we did wrong in our last lifetime.

Attorney Solsky: For the record, I'm Lisabritt Solsky, I'm the Deputy Medicaid Director. Representative Pilotte was kind enough to bring this bill at our request, because this board is administratively attached to Health and Human Services.

And just by way of background, HPPA privacy regulations imposed a responsibility on states to create a privacy board that would determine if and when requests for personal health information may be released for health

research. So it has a very limited scope and that may get to Senator Fuller Clark's question. And so RSA 126:24-E established the board as it relates to vital records information. And for whatever reasons, at the time that the statute was passed, the moniker of an institutional review board was attached to this body. And, unfortunately, an IRB in the traditional sense has a very distinguishable scope of responsibility, and that has created confusion among, particularly the requesters of the data that is the purview of the Board. And just by way of explanation, a traditional IRB only exercises authority over information regarding living identified persons, and they do not traditionally have authority to deny access to data. Conversely, this Board deals with information on individuals who are both living and dead, and the data is both identified and de-identified. And there are specific standards employed by the Board to determine whether requests for the vital records information may be granted.

So, in an effort to make this more user friendly for those who are going before the Board, we wanted to change the name to a more appropriately captioned title, that being the Vital Records Privacy Board for Health Related Research. Hopefully, this will avoid any further unnecessary confusion. We're not looking to change the scope of the responsibilities of the Board in any way, it's simply a name change.

So I'm happy to take any questions if there are any. **See written testimony of Attorney Lisabritt Solsky attached hereto and hereafter referred to as Attachment 1.**

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: All set?

Mr. Stephen Wurtz: Good afternoon, Madam Vice Chair.

Mr. Wurtz: Thank you. My name is Stephen Wurtz, I'm the Acting Director of the Division of Vital Records. And I'm here in support, to speak in support of this bill as well. I think it's been said, pretty much been said as to the explanation. When the IRB label was put to this committee and this committee is represented by members of the Department of State, Division of

Vital Records and Health and Human Services, it's a joint committee. All intentions were an IRB was how we were going to act. And we soon found out that the research and the research community believed an IRB is something completely different. And we don't get into the scope of scrutiny as the IRB. In fact, we require their, the researchers' IRB approval from their institution or facility to be submitted to us for our review when we review for release of vital records and information.

So with that said, again, I'm in support. Any questions, I'll be happy to answer.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Thank you. Are there any questions for Mr. Wurtz? Thank you.

Mr. Wurtz: Thank you.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Thank you.

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Should we have a motion to go into executive session?
