The Department of Administrative Services states this bill will decrease state expenditures by an indeterminable amount in FY 2011 and each year thereafter. There is no fiscal impact on state, county, and local revenue or on county and local expenditures.

METHODOLOGY:

The Department of Administrative Services states this bill increases the Group II state service eligibility requirement for retiree health coverage. The Department states under current law, Group II retirees must only be eligible to retire to receive state-paid retiree health coverage, and this bill requires Group II retirees to have 20 years of creditable service with the state in order to be eligible for the state's retiree health insurance. The Department states the change brought on by the proposed bill will create savings for the state's retiree health insurance program, but it cannot quantify the amount of the impact without an actuarial analysis. The Department does state, by way of illustration, if this proposed eligibility rule had been in effect in 2009, 53% of the 2009 retirees would not be eligible for the state-paid insurance. Assuming that were the case, based on 2010 working rates and also assuming the retirees were under 65 and making the \$65 monthly payment, the Department estimates the state would save approximately \$353,372 in calendar year 2010 on behalf of these 23 Group II employees who retired with less than 20 years of state service, and who would not have been eligible for the insurance.

The New Hampshire Retirement System states this proposed change in eligibility for state retiree health insurance would not impact any of the retirees eligible for the medical subsidy payment, so this bill would not impact the Retirement System.

The Senate Committee on Executive Departments and Administration held a hearing on the following:

HB 1668-FN requiring state creditable service for group II retirees to receive state employee medical benefits.

The Chair, Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, opened the hearing on HB 1668-FN and invited Representative Ken Hawkins to introduce the legislation.

<u>Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6</u>: I would like to open up the hearing on HB 1668 and Representative McMahon is not here at all. Representative Hawkins is here. He didn't plan on speaking, but ...

<u>Representative Ken Hawkins</u>: Thank you, Madam Chair, thank you members of the Senate ED&A Committee. For the record, my name is Ken Hawkins. I represent Hillsborough County 18, the Town of Bedford.

On a normal day, I'd say this is a fairly simple housecleaning bill. What this does is, currently if you're a Group II police, fire, etc., and you work for Manchester, Bedford, Salem, wherever. And you work 15 years and you then transfer to the State Police, you work five years and you retire with State medical benefits. What we're, in the bill, anyone hired after July 1, 2010 is going to have to have 20 years of State service to qualify for the State medical subsidy.

If you look at the fiscal note, if this had been in effect, the Administrative Services thinks that it will reduce expenditures by \$355,000 calendar '10, just on the basis of the 23 people that retired without 20 years of State service.

And I'll answer any questions. I'm trying to keep it ...

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Senator Downing.

<u>Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22</u>: Thank you, Madam Chair. Representative Hawkins, what is the time period now? Is there anything in place? I know that Group I, I think it's 15 years. So didn't know if it was lower than the 20 years.

<u>Representative Hawkins</u>: No, Group II I think is 20 years. Anybody hired after 2003, and I can copy this.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: It's line 6 of the bill.

<u>Representative Hawkins</u>: And if they have, and for Group I, if they had 10 years service and they began work before 2003, 20 years of service after. Hired after July 1, 2003, 30 years forever. Right now, they have to have 20 years of service, but it doesn't have to be State service.

Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22: So if I might, Madam Chair?

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Follow-up, Senator Downing.

<u>Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22</u>: So all it says is clarify that, that it has to be State service.

<u>Representative Hawkins</u>: Yes, sir. So if they have five years of service in the community and come in and get the 20 years State, they'll now have 25 service, but they've satisfied the 20 for the medical subsidy. So they'll have 62.5 percent of salary instead of 50 percent of salary.

<u>Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6</u>: Okay. Any further questions? Alright, thank you very much. Representative McMahon, Representative Hawkins explained the bill. Would you like to go further?

<u>Representative Patricia McMahon</u>: As long as you're satisfied, and I understand you did 1602, and thank you for passing that.

<u>Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6</u>: Might do the same here if everybody's comfortable. Does anybody have any questions of the prime sponsor before I close the hearing? Was there anybody else here who wanted to speak to HB 1668?

<u>Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24</u>: I just, I do have a question, I'm sorry, Jackie.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: That's okay.

<u>Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24</u>: Okay, were there objections to the changes, this change in the House that we're not hearing here today?

Representative McMahon: Senator, thank you very much.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Could you identify yourself?

<u>Representative McMahon</u>: For the record, I'm Ricia McMahon, State Representative from Sutton and Newbury. And good to be here, Madam Chair and members of the Committee.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Welcome.

<u>Representative McMahon</u>: There were not any individuals testifying against this. This was a clarification. Actually, it was a big "aha" about a year ago, and we talked about putting it on Senate Bill 2. We did the special and extra duty pay, that was successful. But it seemed a little bit complicated in the rush of things.

Essentially, what was discovered through Administrative Services and the Personnel Office is that individuals in Group II, specifically, were working in the communities, wherever, Concord, Plymouth, wherever. And in their 19th year, they would switch over to State service. Whether it be the Department of Corrections or another Group II position. And that one year allowed them and their spouse then to be eligible for the medical benefits for the rest of their lives. So it seemed to those of us who were looking at fairness that – and right now it's about \$1,090 per person per month – for those who from 55 to 65 if they would retire, they would get that benefit. And then it would be a little bit more expensive as people got older. So that is over \$2,000 ...

<u>Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6</u>: The fiscal note, on 23 people for one year, it's \$353,000? That was quite a little gap.

Representative McMahon: Right.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Yeah, okay.

Representative McMahon: You're correct, Senator.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Are there any other questions?

Senator Martha Fuller Clark, D. 24: Thank you.

<u>Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6</u>: Thank you, Representative McMahon. And with that, I'm going to close the hearing.
