What the bill does:

This bill allows the judicial retirement plan to deduct a health insurance premium contribution from monthly retirement allowances of retired judges and spouses.

Summary of testimony received:

Senator Cilley

- Introduced SB 357-FN for Senator Reynolds, the Prime Sponsor, who was unable to attend the hearing. SB 357-FN allows the judicial retirement plan to deduct a health insurance premium contribution from monthly retirement allowances of retired judges and spouses.

Howard Zibel, Judicial Branch

- SB 357-FN was introduced as a result of HB 2 from 2009. Section 54 of 2009 HB 2 states that: The retirement system shall not deduct from the monthly retirement allowance of retired state employees under the age of 65 years receiving medical and surgical benefits provided pursuant to RSA 21-I: 30, the premium contribution amounts of \$65 per month for each such retiree and \$65 per month for each applicable spouse; provided that the charge to each household shall not exceed \$130 per month. Deducted amounts, which shall be in addition to and notwithstanding any amounts payable by the retirement system pursuant to RSA 100-A:52, RSA 100-A:52-a, and RSA 100-A:52-b, shall be deposited in the employee and retiree benefit risk management fund. In the event the retiree's monthly allowance is insufficient to cover the certified contribution amount, the retirement system shall so notify the department of administrative services, which shall invoice and collect from the retiree the remaining contribution amount.
- There are approximately eight judges under the age of 65 who are retired, there is currently no authority in statute for the judicial retirement plan to deduct a health insurance premium contribution from monthly retirement allowances of retired judges and spouses.
- Wants to bring an amendment to get the funds to the right place but needs to confirm which fund this should go to.

Funding:

The Office of Legislative Budget Assistant is unable to complete a fiscal note for this bill as it is awaiting information from the New Hampshire Retirement System. When completed, the fiscal note will be forwarded to the Senate Clerk's Office.

The Senate Committee on Executive Departments and Administration held a hearing on the following:

The acting Chair, Senator Michael Downing, opened the hearing on SB 357 and invited Senator Jacalyn Cilley, representing Senator Deborah Reynolds, to introduce the legislation.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Thank you, Mr. Chair. And for the record, my name is Jackie Cilley and I serve District 6, including the wonderful communities of Rochester, Somersworth, Barrington, Madbury and Nottingham. And the Chair was quite right, I am introducing this bill on behalf of Senator Reynolds, who is otherwise detained in her own committee.

You'll see that the intent of this bill is to authorize the Judicial Retirement Plan to deduct health insurance premium contributions from allowances. And there are folks from the court system that will testify as to the content and intention of this bill. So I will, without further ado, allow them to get up and explain it. Thank you.

Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22: Thank you, Senator. Any questions for Senator Cilley? Seeing none. We have a sign up sheet? Let's see, Howard Zibel. Howard? Howard Zibel, if you would step forward, please.

Senator Betsi DeVries, D. 18: Back in the hot seat, as you predicted.

Attorney Zibel: Thank you, members of the Committee. Again, Howard Zibel, General Counsel of the Supreme Court and the Judicial Branch. This bill originates because in the last budget, last June, the Legislature put into

CAN

effect a payment by retirees who are under age 65, of \$65 per month for their health insurance.

And in fact, I have as a handout although I should have labeled it, but I took it from where I had it in the computer, which had without labels. What I am passing out is Section 54 of House Bill 2, the trailer bill, which instituted this payment for retirees under the, state retirees who are under the New Hampshire Retirement System and this allows the Retirement System to deduct the monthly allowance. In judicial branch, non-judicial employees are under the Retirement System. We're all subject to this, just like legislative branch employees and executive branch employees. See statute reference attached hereto and referred to as Attachment 1.

But there is a separate retirement plan for judges. It was enacted by the Legislature in 2003, called the Judicial Retirement Plan. It is separate from the New Hampshire Retirement System, funded separately. It replaced the old system, which was pay as you go. The retirement benefits were just funded each year and that was a disaster waiting to happen. And now there's an actuarially based system, the Judicial Retirement Plan.

Now why this bill comes up, is that when the Legislature made the determination that retirees under 65 should contribute to health care, the Court system, New Hampshire Supreme Court decided to do the same thing for judges who are retired under 60. Judges can retire and receive a pension as early as, under 65. I should say, as early as 60 judges can retire and receive a pension with a certain number of years of service. And I believe there are about eight judges who are under 65 who are now retired and we're paying the healthcare. So as a matter of fairness, the Court instituted the payment.

There was no authority in the statute for the Judicial Retirement Plan to automatically deduct that monthly payment from the pension. We have been billing it to the judges since we instituted the payment, and they've been paying. Almost all of them have been paying. And this seeks legislation to allow the Judicial Retirement System to make the monthly deduction. Chuck Douglas, who's the Executive Director of the Judicial Retirement Plan, supports this. For the nitty gritty administration of the system, cutting checks and stuff like that, they use the New Hampshire Retirement System. I think they pay the Retirement System to do this for them. The person in the Retirement, New Hampshire Retirement System who handles all this administrative detail said this won't be a problem.

There is one reason, however, that I would like you to hold off exec'ing on this bill today. I hoped to have an amendment for you today, and the financial

person in the Court system didn't get back to me with my request, which admittedly didn't come to her until Saturday. I've got to tell you, the pace of this legislative session, especially on the House side, is incredible for those of us who are trying to work with it.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Tell us something we don't know.

Attorney Zibel: So I'd ask you to hold it because the amendment I need is to get the funds to the right place. And that, it says deducted amount, this was drafted by Legislative Services, deducted amount shall be used to pay for plan retiree, etc. But they don't pay it. The Retirement System does it. It has to get into the right fund. It may just be the General Fund, because that's where it's paid for. It has to get into the right fund. Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22: Right.

Attorney Zibel: But I want to know that from my financial type. For example, you see in the statute I passed out from House Bill 2, it says shall be deposited in the employee and retirement, retiree benefit risk management fund. Now, we're not a part of that fund, so I got to find out where this is supposed to go, and I'd ask you to hold off and I will do it as quickly as I can.

And should I get that to the Chair?

Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22: Yes, please.

Attorney Zibel: And that's my testimony. And I did talk to Senator Reynolds, who's the prime sponsor. She cooperates with the Judicial Branch and sponsors bills as Chairman of Judiciary that we ask for. I don't think it is a good thing for the Judicial Branch to be shopping around, looking for sponsors. She, as an accommodation, sponsors, you know, within reason what we ask. And she's tied up in Judiciary all day.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: That's why I introduced it for her.

Attorney Zibel: Right.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Are there any questions for Mr. Zibel? Okay. When do you think you can get this amendment to us?

Attorney Zibel: I hope by the end of the week.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Oh good, okay, because I think it would be nice. This one's pretty simple and consistent with everything else, it would be nice to get this done next week.

Attorney Zibel: Yup.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Thank you.

Attorney Zibel: Good, thank you.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: I'm handing you back the gavel.

Senator Michael W. Downing, D. 22: Yup.

Senator Jacalyn L. Cilley, D. 6: Are there any others who want to testify on this bill? With that, I'll close the hearing on SB 357.

Patrick,

Thank you for the reminder. Actually, our financial manager, Dale Trombley, got the language to me last week after discussions with the department of administrative services. The judicial branch reimburses administrative services for the cost of health insurance for retired judges; therefore, it is the judicial branch that is ultimately paying this expense. It was agreed between the judicial branch and the department of administrative services that it would be best if the judicial retirement plan remitted the deducted amounts directly to the judicial branch. That is what is reflected in the attached amendment. I also eliminated the last sentence of the inserted statutory section. I do not feel strongly on that score. By way of explanation, that last sentence was borrowed from section 54 of last session's HB 2, which dealt with the NHRS deducting the \$65 contribution from the pension checks of its under 65 year old state retirees receiving health insurance. I can understand why that sentence was in that section since the NHRS pays some very small pension checks. On the other hand, every judicial retirement plan monthly check would easily cover this contribution to health insurance costs for judicial retirees under age 65. Thus, that last sentence is unnecessary in SB 357. Call or write if you have any questions – direct dial # is 513-5438.
