The Committee Member, Senator Molly Kelly, opened the hearing on SB 410 and invited the prime sponsor, Senator Kathleen Sgambati, to introduce the legislation.

Senator Kathleen G. Sgambati, D. 4: Thank you, Madam Chair. For the record, I'm Kathleen Sgambati, Senator for District 4. And, I'm going to introduce the infant mortality study bill.

For the last three years, our infant mortality rate has steadily moved forward, and in the wrong direction. We have shown increases in 2004, 2005, and 2006, which was the last year that we have data for. According to the Casey Foundation, in 2006, and the Casey Foundation is the group that does the kids count data, there were 87 infant deaths in New Hampshire.

We rank first or second, and have for decades in the kids count ratings, but yet, in infant mortality we rank 17th, and that's not uncommon. It's been, that pulls down all of the other work that's been done in the state. And, I talked to neonatologists, I've talked to the children's health officials, I get varied answers, and the answers are inconclusive.

So, it seems incumbent on us to ask why, and to see if there's a way to prevent infant mortality, at a rate higher than what we're doing.

So, I submitted this bill simply to ask and answer the questions. For me this is an area where I don't have a solution, I don't think others do. They don't...I can't get a definitive answer as to why we are consistently higher in this area, so this is truly an area for a study bill. And so, I think our consistently, sort of marginal performance in this area deserves that, and I would ask you to support the study committee. So, with that, I'd be happy to answer questions.

Senator Peggy Gilmour, D. 12: Any questions?

<u>Senator Molly Kelly, D. 10</u>: Senator, just a question more for you to have the opportunity to answer, because I obviously support this bill is that, you know we've been working on not increasing our study committees and councils.

Senator Kathleen G. Sgambati, D. 4: That's correct.

Senator Molly Kelly, D. 10: And yet, you're asking here this morning to create a new committee, and I just wanted your response to the importance of this committee.

Senator Kathleen G. Sgambati, D. 4: Well, and I would be happy if this got merged into the larger structure based on the last bill, but, you know, a lot of times we end up with an issue that we're not sure how to handle, or we want to delay, and so we put it into study; for me this is a legitimate cause for study. There is an issue where New Hampshire does not rank well compared to our demographics. We are consistently, you know, in a third to way down in infant mortality rates, so for me this is an area of very legitimate study; we don't know why, and we don't have the answers as to how to correct it. So, I think that this is what studies are intended to do.

Senator Molly Kelly, D. 10: Thank you.

Senator Kathleen G. Sgambati, D. 4: Thank you.

# **Infant Mortality Study**

For the last three years, our infanyt mortality rated has climbed. Nh has shown stead increases in 2004, 2005 and 2006- the last year that we have data for. According to Annie B Casey Foundation in 2006, there were 87 infant deaths.

NH ranks 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in overall child health – and has for decades. Yet on infant mortality we rank 17<sup>th</sup> instead of 1<sup>st</sup>.

When I have asked neonatologists and other children's health experts why, the answers are varied and inconclusive.

It seems incumbent on us to answer why —— and to see if there is a way to prevent these deaths. I submitted this bill to ask and answer questions. While study bills are not loved by many of us who have to spend the extra time serving on them, I do believe our consistently poor performance in this area deserves study and I ask for your support.

# SB 410 Chapter 43:1, Laws of 2010

An Act establishing a committee to study New Hampshire's rate of infant mortality and develop proposals for remediation.

# Final Report Findings

The above-named Joint Legislative Study Committee selected to study New Hampshire's rate of infant mortality and develop proposals for remediation, having duly met offers the following final report:

- 1. From 1997 to 2009, the statistical rates for the Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) has not changed significantly. During this twelve year period there was normal statistical variation with the rate. That is if the IMR went up, it correlated with an increase in births.
- 2. The leading causes of death in infants are:
  - a. Congenital Anomalies
  - b. Prematurity
  - c. SIDS/Sudden Unexplained Infant Death
  - d. Complications of the placenta, cord and membranes
  - e. Effects from maternal complications from pregnancy
- 3. DHHS has been partnering with different agencies to study the problem. They have worked with Dartmouth College regarding congenital anomalies and promoted safe sleeping positions which has reduced the incidence of SIDS..
- 4. The department has had success with home visitation programs that are funded through TANF. Only those moms that are currently eligible for Medicaid are served. Currently there are approximately 900 mothers participating in home visitation. DHHS also has the

- 511 telephone text program that offers advice to concerned mothers.
- 5. The committee is concerned that resources and staff time could be diverted to form a new study committee when the subject is already being dealt with through DHHS, the child fatality committee and other study committees.

# Recommendations

The Committee was unanimous in its recommendations.

- 1. As the Department of Health and Human Services' sub-division on Maternal and Child Health Services has been studying the issue and has limited resources, the members do not wish to take away any resources by duplicating efforts; thus the committee would recommend no further legislative action at this time.
- 2. The committee unanimously recommended that funding be continued to support home visiting and other Department programs that offer health supports to pregnant women and education to parents on infant care.
- 3. The committee would request that the department make periodic reports to the already existing committee on DHHS Oversight Committee on the topic of Infant Mortality Rates.
