HOUSE BILL **119**

AN ACT relative to agency membership on the information technology council.

This bill clarifies that an agency head appointed to the information technology council by the governor may in turn appoint a designee to the council.



The Professional Licensing Unit under the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) provides management and supervision to six DHHS Health Professional Boards and two other licensing professions that are directly under DHHS but do not have advisory or administratively attached boards, totaling eight regulated professions. Three of these professions are regulated by Boards that are administratively attached to DHHS; that is to say that the Boards have the licensing, disciplinary, and rulemaking authority. Of the remaining five professions, three of which have advisory boards, DHHS has the licensing, disciplinary, and rulemaking authority. See below for a list of these boards/professions and the DHHS and Board responsibilities.

For the five professions listed above, DHHS is responsible for all of the licensing, investigatory, disciplinary, and rulemaking functions. DHHS reviews and approves/denies applications for licensure, conducts investigations of complaints, carries out any necessary disciplinary action, writes administrative rules and drafts legislation. Along with these functions, DHHS is also responsible for all of the duties carried out for the administratively attached boards as explained above.


