Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the juvenile delinquency 2 and child in need of services statutes.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
 - (b) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
- 8 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to 9 the duties of the committee.
 - 3 Duties. The committee shall study RSA 169-B, relative to juvenile delinquency, and RSA 169-D, relative to children in need of services, including the need to revise or amend the statutes in order to resolve conflicts between the 2 chapters of law. The committee shall consult with the department of health and human services, division for juvenile justice services and division for children, youth, and families, the department of education, the law enforcement community, and others with information and testimony relevant to the study.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2011.
 - 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Rep. Dowling, prime sponsor

Rep. Dowling introduced House Bill 168 and explained about juveniles facing difficulty "CHINS" (Children In Need of Services)

Explained who could sign and the procedure that follows to educate new representatives. One must have permission to attend the court during these cases due to the minors involved. Cautions that this program will be a focus this session in budgeting.

<u>Diversion Programs</u>: She explained county petitions for share of money because they must pay for diversion in the county. She notices changes made "last year" and emphasizes the many variations in law as it relates to ages.

She questions if more juveniles are going on the work load of parole and other officers. Also refers to SAG Committee and the Youth Development Center (YDC) small part of juvenile delinquency.

Rep. Robbins: Q. Asks for specifics as to conflicts between JD and CHIN.

Rep. Dowling: Ans. More conflict within each law. Refers to age change 18 to 17. Reason being budgetary "transport to YDC.

Rep. Robbins: Questions timeliness of final report and deadlines for legislation in second year of session.

Rep. Moran: Ans. YES

Rep. Gargasz: Question? "pre CHINS?"

Rep. Dowling: Ans. Diversion_committee in every county. Explains working together with Children and Family Law and Criminal Justice and Public Safety.

Rep. Gargasz: Q. What about the committees and county responsibility?

Rep. Dowling: Discussed.

Rep. Lovejoy: Q. What about the intent of House Bill 168?

Stated RSA 169B and RSA 169D, since 1969 amended many times, i.e. age of 17 to 18, etc. Refers to learning over 40 years the many influences that affect behavior, etc. Now, due to added education, is an appropriate time for this study. Child who hasn't committed a crime should not be incarcerated.


