HOUSE BILL            ***197-LOCAL***

AN ACT                relative to processing absentee ballots.

SPONSORS:            Rep. Day, Hills 7

COMMITTEE:          Election Law

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ANALYSIS

This bill eliminates certain restrictions relating to when absentee ballots may be processed.

AN ACT                   relative to processing absentee ballots.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1           1 Processing Absentee Ballots. Amend RSA 659:49 to read as follows:  
2           659:49 Processing Absentee Ballots.

3           [~~I.~~] Processing of previously received absentee ballots [~~shall~~] **may** begin [~~at 1:00 p.m.~~] **any**  
4 **time after the moderator declares the polls open.** The processing of the absentee ballots shall  
5 not unnecessarily interfere with normal voting procedures, nor shall the polls be closed at any time  
6 during the processing of such ballots. Absentee ballots which are received [~~after 1:00 p.m. and~~] prior  
7 to 5:00 p.m. **on election day** shall be processed as soon after receipt as possible. Under no  
8 circumstances shall absentee ballots be **segregated and** counted [~~prior to the closing of the polls~~]  
9 **separately as absentee ballots, but they shall be intermingled with all other ballots, after**  
10 **being processed through the checklist, and they shall be counted with all other ballots**  
11 **after the polls are closed.**

12           [~~II.—Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph I, upon the written challenges of 10 or~~  
13 ~~more voters who are present at the polls no later than 1:00 p.m., the moderator shall postpone the~~  
14 ~~processing of all absentee ballots until after the polls close and prior to the counting of all ballots cast~~  
15 ~~in the election.~~]

16           2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

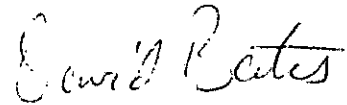
