AN ACT establishing multi-use number plates.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Chapter; Multi-Use Plates. Amend RSA by inserting after chapter 261-A the following 2 new chapter:

CHAPTER 261-B

MULTI-USE PLATES

5 261-B:1 Multi-Use Plates Authorized. The department shall issue multi-use plates upon receipt 6 of an application meeting the requirements of RSA 261-B:3. Except as otherwise provided in this 7 chapter, multi-use plates shall have the same effect and be issued in the same manner as other 8 number plates. Multi-use number plates shall include the design submitted by the applicant and 9 bear a registration number beginning with a letter of the alphabet designated by the director for the 10 applicant. Multi-use number plates shall retain the "live free or die" logo. The department shall not 11 issue vanity multi-use plates.

12 261-B:2 Eligibility. The department shall only accept an application for multi-use plates from 13 an agency of the state of New Hampshire or an entity that is determined by the Internal Revenue 14 Service to be a tax exempt organization pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code 15 and registered with the attorney general.

I. An application for multi-use plates shall provide:

(a) Verification of the applicant's eligibility under RSA 261-B:2.

(b) A design to be placed on the applicant's plate series, which shall occupy an area no
more than 3 inches wide by 4 inches high on the plate surface.

(c) The owner's name and vehicle registration information for at least 1,000 vehicles,
which will be issued the initial multi-use plates in the applicant's plate series.

(d) Sixty dollars for each vehicle listed pursuant to subparagraph (c).

II. After successful submission of the application information under paragraph I, the applicant shall verify annually the applicant's continuing eligibility. Failure to verify eligibility shall result in the termination of the applicant's multi-use plate series.

- 261-B:4 Issuance and Renewal; Fees.

I.(a) The fee for multi-use number plates shall be \$60 per year per set, which shall be in addition to any other registration and number plate fees. Plates issued for vehicles listed by the applicant under RSA 261-B:3, I(c) shall be exempt from this fee for the first year.

HB 335-FN-A - AS INTRODUCED - Page 2 -

1 (b) The department shall retain from fees collected under this chapter an amount as is 2 necessary to recover production and administrative costs as approved by the fiscal committee of the 3 general court. The remaining funds shall be paid to the state treasurer, who shall pay 60 percent of 4 such funds to the applicant entity and 40 percent to the highway fund.

5 II. Multi-use plates shall be issued only upon application for a new registration or renewal of 6 an existing registration. Persons shall not be permitted to transfer an existing registration to a 7 multi-use plate registration except during the registration renewal month.

8 III. Multi-use plates shall only be issued by the division and shall not be available from 9 municipal clerks or other agents of the division.

- IV. Multi-use plates may be used on passenger motor vehicles and recreation vehicles.
- 11 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.

<u>Rep. Rhodes</u> introduced the bill as prime sponsor along with <u>Rep. Karen Umberger</u> (Co-sponsor) Gave a brief history of the bill ad the process leading up to it. It is designed to produce a solution that would please many of the NH Citizens and be workable with DMV. Copies of the proposed design were distributed. they included a copy of a plate similar to the UNH plate requested in HB 610. Originations wishing to have a plate would be responsible for the design of much of the plate and the registration number would be a letter number combination and there would be a 1000 plate minimum required but that number was not set in stone.

Director Bailey, NHDMV supports the bill. The intent would be to have a separate initial letter for each group requesting the plates followed by a sequential number.

There were several questions about Initial plates and the ability of DMV to reject a emblem design. There needs a little bit of work and the committee will work with DMV and the sponsors to address several small issues in the Senate.
