Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Paragraph; Jurisdiction of Counties. Amend RSA 23:1-a by inserting after paragraph III 1 2 the following new paragraph: IV. Any county government located within the service territory of a municipal electric utility 3 established prior to July 1, 1997 that does not voluntarily unbundle its rates and allow access to 4 competitive retail electric supply markets as provided in RSA 38:34, shall have access to such 5 markets and may negotiate competitive, reasonable, unbundled rates on behalf of the towns and 6 cities within its boundaries. 7 8
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
