A RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to remove tax breaks for companies that send jobs out of the country.

1 Whereas, the unemployment rate in the United States remains high; and

2 Whereas, it is not in the interest of the country's economic security for companies to outsource
3 jobs during times of high unemployment; and

4 Whereas, current tax breaks encourage companies to outsource jobs to other countries; and

5 Whereas, one way of creating jobs in this country is to encourage companies to invest more in the
6 United States; and

7 Whereas, companies operating in this country are having a difficult time rebounding from the
8 economic crises; and

9 Whereas, tax breaks should be used to reward companies that create and keep jobs in this
10 country; and

11 Whereas, it is in the interest of long-term security and development of the country to build
12 business in the United States; now, therefore, be it

13 Resolved by the House of Representatives:

14 That the New Hampshire house of representatives hereby urges the United States Congress to
15 remove tax breaks for companies that send jobs out of the country; and

16 That copies of this resolution, signed by the speaker of the house, be forwarded by the house
17 clerk to each member of the New Hampshire Congressional delegation.




