Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

3 XXIX. "Reverse distributor" means a person or persons who facilitate the removal, disposal,

I. Such license shall expire annually on June 30. An application together with a reasonable fee as established by the board shall be filed annually on or before July 1.

HB 504 FISCAL NOTE

AN ACT licensing reverse distributors of drugs and requiring manufacturers and wholesalers to report changes in ownership.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Board of Pharmacy states this bill will increase state general fund revenues by an indeterminable amount in FY 2011, and by \$11,000 in FY 2012 and each year thereafter. This bill will have no fiscal impact on county and local revenues, or state, county, and local expenditures.

METHODOLOGY:

The Board of Pharmacy states this bill requires licenses for reverse distributors of drugs and new owners of manufactures and wholesalers. The Board estimates approximately eight reverse distributors would be required to register with the Board as a result of this bill. Additionally, the Board estimates 36 manufacturers, wholesalers, distributors, or brokers change ownership annually. The Board states the cost for a single license is \$250, therefore state general fund revenue will increase by \$11,000 (8 reverse distributors + 36 manufacturers = 44 new licenses annually * \$250 per license).

This bill does not appropriate funds or create new positions. However, the Board estimates this bill will divert some Board resources from current functions to process the 44 new licenses. The Board states each new reverse distributor will need to be inspected, requiring roughly 1.5 hours for transportation and labor for one inspector (at Labor Grade 27). Additionally, each license will require 30 minutes of time for one clerk (at \$16 per hour) plus \$5 for paperwork such as postage fees, storage, and supplies. The Board states it will be able to absorb these costs with existing resources.

<u>Rep. Frank Case, Rock 1</u> Prime sponsor, the bill was sponsored a

•Prime sponsor, the bill was sponsored on behalf of the Board of Pharmacy. It allows "reverse distributors" to be included in the business of New Hampshire pharmacies. The term needs to be in statute for the Board to be able to make rules regarding the reverse distributors.

•Pharmacies are in a unique situation—they must order and stock prescription drugs in case patients come in and needs a prescription filled, but the pharmacist does not know which drugs will or will not sell. •When prescription drugs reach their expiration date a pharmacist cannot put them on the shelf with a half off sticker, as with other products, so these reverse distributors will buy them back at a discount for the manufacturers.

•Speaking to the fiscal note—it actually says the Board will increase revenue for the general fund through licensing these individuals.

•<u>Senator De Blois asked</u>: To clarify, these drugs have a shelf life but the reverse distributers buy them back after they expire?

-Rep. Case: Yes, that is their business.

-<u>Senator De Blois</u>: Then they sell the drugs back to the manufacturers? -<u>Rep. Case</u>: Yes, it is easier for the manufacturers to do business with a small number of reverse distributors than it would be to buy back from every pharmacy in the country.

Jay Queenan, Executive Director, New Hampshire Board of Pharmacy •In support, the Board sponsored this bill because it licensed distributors but does not have the authority to license reverse distributors at this time. Reverse distributors are licensed in other states and the practice is quite common.

•The law has never spelled out that the Board be informed when there is a change of ownership of manufacturers, wholesalers, brokers, distributors, or now reverse distributors. This bill requires the organization to inform the Board that there is a change of ownership and who is the new owner.

•Senator Sanborn asked: Do any other industries have reverse distributors?

-Response: No. However, pharmacists always want guarantees sales. In order to provide an incentive for pharmacists to stock their drugs, branded manufacturers will take back the drugs because of their residual value. To make it easier for the pharmacists and manufacturers, the manufacturers created a middle-man, the reverse distributors, who contract with the pharmacies. The reverse distributor takes the drugs back, sells them back to the manufacturers, takes a piece of the credit and gives the rest of the credit back to the pharmacists. They also make sure that drugs with no residual value get disposed of properly.

•<u>Senator Sanborn asked</u>: After these prescription drugs reach their expiration date they must be removed from the shelves. What do the reverse distributors and manufacturers do with the expired drugs? Do they out a new expiration date on the bottle and sell them to a third-word nation?

-Response: I have no reason to believe the drugs are used inappropriately. The ethical branded manufacturers have a history of giving a credit for their expired drugs, mainly to get their drugs into the store.
