*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

- 1       1 Bridge Named in Honor of Corporal Timothy Gibson, U.S.M.C. Pursuant to RSA 4:43, the  
2 bridge on the F. E. Everett Turnpike at exit 11 that passes over Greeley street in the town of  
3 Merrimack, being designated as bridge number 113/089 in the state bridge inventory, shall be named  
4 the Corporal Timothy Gibson, U.S.M.C. Memorial Bridge in honor of Corporal Timothy Gibson,  
5 U.S.M.C. who was killed in action in Iraq in 2005. Appropriate signage or markers may be placed at  
6 the site.
- 7       2 Signage. The cost of design, construction, maintenance, and installation of any signage,  
8 replacement signage, or other markers authorized under section 1 of this act shall not be a charge to  
9 the state. However, the design, construction, and installation of any signage or other markers  
10 authorized under this act shall be approved by the department of transportation.
- 11       3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

**What the bill does:** This bill names a bridge in the town of Merrimack in honor of Corporal Timothy Gibson, U.S.M.C. who was killed in action in Iraq in 2005.

**Who supports the bill:** Sen. Carson, Sen. Lambert, Sen. White, Rep. Chandler and Rep. Baldasaro

**Who opposes the bill:** No one

### Summary of testimony received:

Senator Rausch opened the hearing on House Bill 525 and recognized Representative Notter to introduce the bill.

Representative Notter, the prime sponsor, explained to the Committee that after September 11, 2001 many men and women joined the armed forces to assure no future attacks occurred again on the United States. She explained that Timothy Gibson was of these people. While she did not know him personally, he was from her town and when he was killed the entire town was deeply affected. A constituent had asked to draft a bill and this is how this piece of legislation came about. She stated the Town Council in Merrimack passed approval for this bill unanimously.



Senator Rausch recognized Senator White to speak.

Senator White is in favor of the bill and he urged the Committee to pass this legislation.

With no one else wishing to speak Senator Rausch closed the public hearing.

**Action:** Senator Kelly moved Ought to Pass with a second from Senator Boutin. Senator Rausch called the vote and the Committee voted OTP 5-0.
