

Summary of testimony received: The hearing opened at 2:20 PM

Senator Sharon M. Carson, D. 14: Prime Sponsor

- This is the third time this bill has come forward. It passed 2 sessions ago and a commission was formed, which issued an interim report, but more time was needed to further study the topic. In 2008, the bill was once again passed, though no action was taken to establish a commission.
- •This fall New Hampshire sent over 1,000 National Guardsmen to serve in the war on terrorism and it is important to now fully address the issue.
- There has been a lot of evidence from studies conducted by private organizations and the Department of Defense of the types of traumatic stress and traumatic brain injuries being suffered by our service men and women.
 - -In New Hampshire, a soldier committed suicide a few months ago after returning home from the war as a result of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.
- •It is our duty and responsibility to protect those who serve our state and our nation. We need a unified system, to support these servicemen and women when they return home.
- This bill will establish a commission to look at this issue, look at the resources New Hampshire has, and come up with a plan to help them.
- •Senator Kelly asked: In the past 2 attempts to complete this commission has it been difficult to get people together and if so would you like to extend the date of the report passed December 1, 2011?
 - -Response: In 2008, many people tracking the bill called to ask why no action was taken. I talked to the Speaker of the House but it appears that no committee was formed, or if it was no meetings were called. When the first commission was formed many people wanted to be involved, including Sen. Janeway who attended every meeting, and many mental health professionals. Once a committee is formed and a chair chosen, attendance should not be a problem.
- •Senator Bradley asked: Can this issue be addressed by any existing commission?
 - -Response: Though we are in a continual process of consolidating commissions, I know of none willing to take on this issue at this time. This commission has a definitive ending date and should have recommendations that can be implemented in the next legislative session.
- •Senator Bradley asked: Would you be willing to add a representative of veteran service organizations to the commission.
 - -Response: Yes.

Steven Wade, Executive Director, Brain Injury Association of New Hampshire

- •In support, represents families and caregivers of service members who sustain brain injuries as well children and adults who sustain brain injuries
- •Three issues need to be addressed by this commission that were not addressed by the original commission
 - (1) Latency: results of brain injury sometimes take up to 10 years postinjury to show. A strategy for dealing with latency should be addressed by a commission.

(2) Co-occurring Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD): this needs to addressed more to create strategies and support systems.

(3) Mild Traumatic Brain Injury: If multiple concussions add onto one another they can create a serious brain injury. Symptoms are often difficult to detect physically, they are cognitive like behavioral changes.

•Senator De Blois asked: Why is the commission limited to soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan, why not expand it to include all combat veterans returning from war?

-Response: We would support and applaud the expansion. Traumatic brain injury is the signature injury of the two most recent wars because of the IED blasts. There is a range of others not currently covered, like those sustaining injuries at training camp at home.

Senator John S. Barnes, Jr., D. 17

•Co-sponsor, the bill should be expanded to include veterans from other wars beyond Iraq and Afghanistan as well as those who sustain injuries while in training.

Ed Josephson, New Hampshire State Veterans Advisory Committee

- •In support, the committee comprises 16 veteran organizations, 2 senators and 2 representatives and strongly supports the legislation for a third time
- •Would like the members of the previous commission to remain on new commission to share knowledge, insight, and experience.
- •Supports expanding the commission to encompass all veterans
- •Senator Bradley suggested that the bill be amended to include all service men and women, not just those who served in Iraq and Afghanistan. He also suggested adding 2 additional members from the Veterans Advisory Council to the commission, and allowing for continuity of commission members from the previous commission.

The SVAC position on SB 140: establishing a commission to study the effects of post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury suffered by New Hampshire soldiers

and veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan.

The SVAC met an February 8th and voted unanimously to support SB 140 with the changes discussed at the Executive Session following the hearing on February 3rd.

We during our discussions the suggestion was made to consider adding to the commission a representative on the New Hampshire Veterans Home. The rationale for this suggestion is the anticipated expansion of the scope of the commission's work to cover all veterans and the reality of the Veterans Home's considerable experience with the emergence of latent post-traumatic stress disorder among its residents.

Chapter 115-D, Laws of 2011

Senate Bill 102

Established a commission to study the effects of post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury suffered in the line of duty by members of the armed forces and veterans.

Meetings

The Commission had its organizational meeting on September 7th, 2011 where Jo Moncher was nominated to serve as Chairman and Mary Morin was nominated to serve as Secretary. Since that meeting, the Commission has met twice and will be meeting monthly.

Purpose of the Commission

The Commission has agreed to do more than "study the effects of PTSD and TBI" and will be taking a more proactive role in identifying gaps and goals to address this issue, as well as making recommendations for proposed legislation.

Findings & Activities

Commission Message

The Commission acknowledges the heroic services veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan, as well as NH's older veteran population, have rendered to our country, and cannot state strongly enough the obligation our nation and New Hampshire owes to those men and women who have been injured as a result of their service. The hidden injuries of combat, including post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury, can be severe and lifelong, and require a comprehensive, coordinated, and funded system of services and support. While there are promising programs to assist veterans with TBI and PTSD, and their families, in general resources are fragmented. Some veterans don't know about, and have trouble accessing treatment and services, and some veterans fall through the cracks.

Accomplishments

- The Commission has reviewed the Commission on PTSD and TBI Interim Report (HB 1335, Ch.257:1, Laws of 2008).
- The Commission has reviewed the Recommendations presented from the NH Military & Civilian TBI Collaborative.
- The Commission has filed an LSR to extend the Commission from May 2012 to May 2013.
- The Commission has extended its membership according to recommendations from HB 1335 Interim Report, as well as Commission Recommendations.
- The Commission has identified the following goals to be researched, discussed and possibly addressed:
 - Survey to all Veterans and Family Members to learn more about their health care, perception of issues, and ability to access care
 - O Data Collection & Analysis Although NH has access to limited national data on veterans with PTSD and TBI, our State does not have actual data regarding veterans with PTSD and TBI who reside in NH. As a starting point, the Commission will research the possibility of securing data for veterans who served post 9-1-1.
 - O Screening Once the survey to all veterans is completed, the Commission will review the survey results and identify possible screening initiatives
 - o Education and Outreach The Commission will identify focus populations for education and outreach, including law enforcement and hospital emergency rooms.
 - o Identification, Development and Coordination of PTSD and TBI programs, services, and sites for treatment and follow up.
