1 Definition of Renewable Generation Facility. Amend RSA 72:73 to read as follows:

3 facility" means a facility which produces electric energy for resale solely by the use, as a primary

4 energy source, of renewable energy [as defined in RSA 374 F:3, V(f)(3)], or a participant-funded

5 electric transmission line designed primarily to transmit renewable electric energy of a

6 design rating in excess of 200 kilovolts that is in excess of 100 miles in length, including the

land, all rights, easements, and other interests thereto, and all dams, buildings, structures, and
other improvements situated thereon which are necessary or incidental to the production or

9 transmission of power at the facility.

10 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony received:

Senator John Gallus, District 1- Prime sponsor

- Hearing opened at 10:28 am
- The bill was introduced at the deadline for submitting legislation as it was still unclear whether towns would have the ability to collect taxes to reach payment in lieu of tax agreements.
 - It has since become clear that they would.
- Amendment #344s introduced.

- The amended legislation, which would replace the bill, came at the request of the City of Berlin.
- The City was concerned and asked for the bill because of the potential impact for 400-500 jobs for the North Country that would be produced by Laidlaw.
- Recommend to accept the changes and ITL it.
- Question from Senator Odell: You are bringing in an amendment and asking to entertain the amendment and then offer ITL?
 - Yes, and that is basically at the request of the City of Berlin.
- Rep. Larry Rappaport, Coos 1
 - If the bill is ITL'ed have nothing to say.

Richard Samson, Resident of Stewartstown

- Request the language be added from testimony (Attachment #1)
 - Requests that after each provider of electricity "within the state of New Hampshire" shall obtain and retire.
 - Believe that our NH or current biomass and hydroelectric plants within our state only should be the benefactors of this bill.

Michael Fitzgerald, DES

- No position.
- Serve on the SEC that would hear affected projects.
- The PUC and DES are reviewing the RPS.
 - The review process began in February and would recommend comprehensive revisions to the current RPS.
- Question from Senator Odell: There is a process underway and any change that would be given would be seen in a report for legislation nest session?
 - Yes, and the intent would be that the report be ready in November or earlier.
- Question from Senator Merrill: In reference to SEC, asked if it could be explained for the record?

- Would like to read a press release from Senator Gallus dated March 15th, 2011.
- The press release explained that SB 118 would have no implications for the Northern Pass.
- Confusion given by SB 118.
- Would like to question why the original bill was poised?
 - Referenced similar concern for HB 302 changing the RPS standards.
- It seems reckless and abusive to get a reaction and then set it aside.

• Would also say that the PUC is reviewing the RPS standards and it would be appropriate for that process to continue.

 - There can be an argument either way and without some clarification there is likely to be litigation.
