Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

239:1 Findings and Purpose. The legislature finds that, through no fault of their own, certain persons entitled to benefits as surviving spouses and dependents of group II members killed in the line of duty have been provided with incorrect information concerning the benefits to which they are entitled over an extended period of time. Such persons have relied in good faith upon this incorrect information and have ordered their lives accordingly. In order to avoid the unfairness that would occur if these errors were retrospectively corrected, the state of New Hampshire will provide such persons in this position with the benefits that they were promised.

239:2 Additional Medical Benefits; Surviving Spouse and Dependents; Group II Member Killed in Line of Duty. On the effective date of this act, if the premium payment under RSA 100-A:52 and RSA 21-I:30-a for the surviving spouse and dependent children of a police officer or firefighter killed in the line of duty, as determined under RSA 21-I:29-a, is not for the full amount of the premium for eligible medical and surgical benefits, and the local political subdivision has elected not to pay the excess cost of the premium for such medical and surgical benefits, the state shall pay the difference between the amount paid by the local political subdivision and the amount under RSA 21-I:30-a, I, so that the benefit is not reduced by the application of any benefit limitation or premium contribution for such surviving spouses and dependent children.

239:3 Application. Nothing in this act shall authorize or require the state to pay for any premium for eligible medical and surgical benefits that was being paid for by the local political subdivision on January 1, 2011.

239:4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

What the bill does: This bill requires that the premium payments for medical and surgical benefits for the surviving spouse and dependent children of a police officer or firefighter killed in the line of duty shall not be reduced.

Who supports the bill: Senator Sharon Carson; Doug Patch, New Hampshire Association of Fire Chiefs; Rep. Al Baldasaro, Rock. Dist. 3; Patricia Kelly, Self; Bob Blaisdell, New Hampshire Troopers and New Hampshire Police Association; Jay Ward, SEA.

Who opposes the bill: No one.

Hearing opened at 9:20 a.m.

#### Summary of testimony received:

• Senator Luther opened the hearing on SB 166 by calling on the bills prime sponsor.

- Senator Sharon Carson stated that this legislation was brought forward because of an incident that happened to a constituent a few years back, which caused lost benefits for a surviving spouse of a police officer who was killed in the line of duty. The incident related to medical premium payments for the beneficiaries which was due to a change in legislation (HB 1645) within the pension system.
- Senator Carson brought this legislation forward in an attempt to rectify the situation created by HB 1645.
- Ms. Patricia Kelley from Londonderry, New Hampshire then testified. Ms. Kelley's husband was a police officer in Derry, New Hampshire. He died suddenly in the line of duty on September 17, 1989 at age 35. He had served about 10 years on the force.
- Shortly after her husband's death, Ms. Kelly received a letter from the New Hampshire Retirement System stating that they would be paying health benefits in full from their subsidy account. This payment continued, unchanged, for over 20 years.
- On February 3, 2010, everything changed. Ms. Kelley received a certified letter from the New Hampshire Retirement System stating that starting the following month Ms. Kelley would be required to pay medical subsidies out of the pension which she presently was receiving.
- Four months later, on July 1st, without notice, another \$400 was taken out for the medical subsidy account. So, essentially, what was previously a monthly pension of \$2,900 was now \$1,300. The letter which she received also stated that, in addition to the pension being reduced by a \$1,000 per month that she could be responsible for all the subsidy arrears, which would have totaled approximately \$90,000.
- Ms. Kelley stated that this obviously caused emotional and financial distress. She was fortunate enough to receive more hours at work, although there are going to be layoffs, and beginning in September, she will be going back to part-time work.
- Ms. Kelley was caught up in this because of the House Bill which passed, but this bill was passed <u>after</u> she was told that her medical subsidies would be paid in full. She thanked the Committee for listening.
- There were no questions from Committee members.
- Senator Luther read into record that Senator Carson, spoke, and was in favor; Patricia Kelly spoke, and was in favor; Doug Patch from NH

Association of Fire Chiefs, in favor, but not speaking. Also, Representative Al Baldasaro, in favor, and wanted to speak, but not in attendance.

• Jay Ward then spoke representing the State Employees Association. He thanked the sponsors of the bill, and also thought it was an important bill to bring back the original intent of the health insurance for the spouse of an officer or safety officer killed in the line of duty. Mr. Ward asked the Committee to look favorably upon this bill.

Senator Luther closed the hearing at 9:28 a.m.

My name is Patricia Kelley, the wife of Thomas Kelly - a Derry New Hampshire police officer who died in the line of duty on September 17, 1989. First, I want to offer my deep appreciation to Senator Carson, Senator D'Allesandro and Senator Bradley, and all the legislators who sponsored this bill.

Tom was a Sergeant with the Derry Police Department, having served ten years on the force at the time of his death at the age of 35. When Tom died, now over twenty years ago, I was pregnant with our second child and my son was not yet 2 years old. Soon after Tom passed away, I was notified by the New Hampshire Retirement System of the benefits my family would receive as the result of Tom giving his life in the course of his duties as a police officer. I was notified, in writing, that these benefits would include health insurance and that "the total premium will be paid through the subsidy account due to [the] benefit being paid under an accidental death".

I am truly thankful that this fully paid health insurance covered my family for over twenty years following Tom's death.

However, in February of 2010 I received a certified letter from the retirement system. This letter (and subsequent notices) notified me that I owed the retirement system over \$90,000.00 dollars

and that the pension Tom had most dearly earned would be reduced by nearly one thousand dollars a month - a reduction of about one third. I am advised that this reduction was made because of a retirement system law passed following Tom's death that placed a cap on these benefits for surviving families of Group II members killed in the line of duty. I remain confused as to how that law could apply to Tom's situation when the law in place at the time of his death contained no such cap.

The reduction in Tom's pension has dramatically affected my family and has even caused me to make the painful decision to drop one of my children from my health insurance coverage. I hope and pray that the intent of SB 166 is that it would apply to Tom and that the reduction in his pension for our family will no longer apply and that the pension and health benefit promised to me when Tom died is restored.

Thank you again for thinking of Tom and all those brave police officers and firefighters who have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Dear Mr. Bernard:

As per our recent telephone conversation, Mrs. Kelly will be receiving a preliminary monthly benefit of \$1,595.33 per month from the New Hampshire Retirement System.

She is also entitled to paid health insurance coverage for herself and any dependent children. At this time, she is being covered under a two-person coverage (spouse and dependent child) at a premium rate of \$292.01. Up until April 28, 1990, she is responsible for \$146.00 of the total premium with the health insurance subsidy paying the remaining cost. After April 28, 1990, the total premium will be paid through the subsidy account due to her benefit being paid under an accidental death. Once we have received the new authorization form including the second child, the premium rate will be \$394.21.

Mrs. Kelly has also received a lump sum distribution of contributions and interest which her husband had contributed to the New Hampshire Retirement System. The total amount of contributions Mr. Kelly had in the system was \$29,663.27 (\$21,184.22 representing contributions and \$8,479.05 being the interest portion). Taxes were withheld at \$1,298.82 with \$22,213.45 of the total amount being taxable. Therefore, she received a check in the amount of \$28,364.45.

The NH Retirement System (NHRS) routinely audits the records and files of retirees and other beneficiaries receiving the medical subsidy benefit pursuant to NH RSA 100-A. Our review of your administrative file confirmed your continuing eligibility for a 3-person medical subsidy pursuant to RSA 100-A:52, I(d), and RSA 100-A:52, II, due to the duty related death of your late husband, Thomas Kelly, as a Derry police officer.

The Local Government Center (LGC) recently informed NHRS that the premium for the medical insurance covering you and your two dependent children has increased to \$2,123.44 per month. In accordance with the aforementioned statutory provisions, the amount of the medical subsidy payable on your behalf is \$1,126.68 per month, determined by multiplying the current applicable rate for a one-person medical subsidy (\$375.56) by three persons (yourself plus two dependents) covered by the medical plan, not to exceed the total plan premium for the medical subsidy eligible individuals (\$2,123.44). After subtracting the medical subsidy payable on your behalf (\$1,126.68) from the current medical insurance premium (\$2,123.44), the balance due is \$996.76 per month, which will be deducted from your monthly pension benefit and forwarded to LGC commencing with your February 2010 benefit payment.

If you are aggrieved by this determination relative to the amount of the medical subsidy payable on your behalf, you may request a hearing within 45 days of the date of this letter pursuant to administrative rule Ret. 204.01(b). The request must be addressed to Attorney Carolyn Johnson, NHRS Hearings Examiner, and be in compliance with the items listed in the enclosed copy of administrative rule Ret. 203.01.

Please be advised that NHRS is reviewing medical subsidy payments made on your behalf for periods prior to the most recent medical insurance premium increase. NHRS will notify you of its findings upon completion of that review.
