AN ACT authorizing nano brewery licensees to sell their products at farmers' markets.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Paragraph; Nano Brewery; Farmers' Markets. Amend RSA 178:12-a by inserting after
2 paragraph IV the following new paragraph:

3 V. A nano brewery licensee may transport its products to a farmers' market, and may sell
4 such products at retail in the original container.



Rep. John Hunt, amendment – Introduced amendment to HB 1172, #0500h. Bill to involve wine consultant added to bill.

Eddie Edwards, Chief Enforcer, NH State Liquor Commission – I'm not sure there is a huge issue with nano brewery and nano markets. People are buying wine on line in New Hampshire; our total sales are approaching \$700,000. If an individual buys 4 bottles of wine and invites friends over for tasting, no law prohibits this activity. If the individual brings wine to a friend's house and leaves an order form behind, this creates a problem. We need to get this kind of activity under control. If we pass this bill, New Hampshire will be the first state to license this activity. Bills intent is to allow maximum of 6 bottles into a sales area. Has a problem with companies like Anheuser Bush going to a farmers' market. Every license in the state is inspected at least once a year. If we get complaints, we visit more frequently.

Rep. Donna Schlachman, prime sponsor – Farmers markets set up to support New Hampshire Agricultural products. New Hampshire wine manufacturers fit this requirement. We need to make sure New Hampshire agricultural products are in the products being offered. Maybe we need to talk to the agricultural department.

The Honorable David Currier of Henniker, representing self – Impressed with the legislation promoting entrepreneurship in New Hampshire; supports the concept. Has a brewery in Henniker would have no problem with opening market up to the larger brewers. The whole concept is made in New Hampshire which he supports.





Testimony

Testimony in Favor of House Bill 1172

I am the brewer and co-founder of Throwback Brewery in North Hampton, which has been open for about 6 months. We use local ingredients at the brewery to make our beer and have been working with NH farmers to coordinate future crops of grain and hops.

Adoption of House Bill 1172 would provide New Hampshire's nano breweries the same opportunity that our wine manufacturers currently enjoy. The option for nano breweries to sell our products at farmers' markets also provides our small businesses a valuable avenue to expand market awareness of our business, which will help to grow and strengthen the businesses and, by association, our local economy.

The sale of beer at the farmers' markets benefits the farmers' markets too, as it

- provides a great way to connect with the community and build important long term relationships;
- enhances the variety of local products available at the markets thus potentially drawing more people to the markets; and
- allows us to celebrate the agricultural aspects of beer, especially those that are directly related to our local farmers who work so hard to grow the ingredients.

OK ~~III. Alcohol consultants shall not sample pour more than 2 ounces, per person, per bottle sampled for wine, not more than 4 ounces, per person for beer and not more than .5 ounces for liquor. Consultants are authorized up to a total of six bottles for sampling per educational event.~~

IV. Alcohol consultants shall ~~removal~~ ^{REMOVE} any unused product after the educational event.

OK ~~VII. A copy of the license shall be in the vehicle while transporting any alcoholic beverages to and from the educational event.~~

VIII. Alcohol consultants shall register each educational event with the liquor commission-division of enforcement and licensing. The commission shall adopt rules, pursuant to RSA 541-A, relative to:

(a) The registration procedures and required information to ensure that consumers are over 21 years of age.

(b) The signature form or other identification procedures to be used by a alcohol consultant to ensure compliance with RSA 179:5 and 178: 27.

IX. Notwithstanding the provisions of law any person holding a alcohol consultant license under this section who serves, permits or allows alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 years of age, shall be guilty of a class B felony and shall have such license permit permanently revoked.

X. Alcohol Consultants shall maintain records for at least 3 years which will permit the commission to ascertain the truthfulness of the information filed and permit the commission to perform an audit of filings upon reasonable request.

XXXI-a. "Farmers' market" means an event or series of events at which 2 or more vendors of agricultural commodities gather for purposes of offering for sale such commodities to the public. Commodities offered for sale must include, but are not limited to, products of agriculture, as defined in RSA 21:34-a. "Farmers' market" shall not include any event held upon any premises owned, leased, or otherwise controlled by any individual vendor selling therein.
