
REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE

License registration forms are mailed out on February 1st and are due back before April 1st. We give licensees information in their registration instructions regarding late registration and lapsed licenses.

In the past, there was a problem with late registrations. It took at least 5 months for the Board's office to complete all registrations. We now have a 3 month procedure which has cut the number of late registrations from approximately 100 to 20 or less. The procedure is as follows:

After a 30 day <u>late</u> registration period, a license lapses. A letter is sent informing licensees of their status. Licensees must fill out the reinstatement application and get a letter of good standing from any state other than New Hampshire where they hold a license. Once this is received, they are scheduled to take a jurisprudence exam (true/false) on the dental rules and law. On the day the exam is taken, the dental or dental hygiene license is reinstated. The Board works with the licensees to complete the entire process within a couple of days.

The licensee is responsible to register each biennium and to be aware of the Dental Practice Act and rules.

LSR 2069.0 Relative to Failure to Renew a Professional or Occupational License

POSITION: Opposed

Dear Honorable Members of the Committee:

This bill provides that the failure to complete a renewal of a professional or occupational license issued by a State Board, Commission or Agency shall not require re-licensure.

This bill would permit any licensee to renew his/her license regardless of how long it had lapsed.

The Department of Safety is opposed to this bill on many fronts. This will create a situation whereby licensees will renew their licenses only when it is convenient for them to do so. Most of the licensees regulated by the Department require some sort of continuing education component, which ensures that the licensee maintains a current minimum level of training in the licensed trade. This bill would negate that system and result in under-educated licensees.

This bill would also negatively affect the steady revenue stream which the Department uses to fund the administrative portion of the system where the licenses are reissued and also the field portion of the system consisting of the inspection and consultation services.

This industry itself will suffer immeasurable set backs as unlicensed and under-educated tradesmen will perform work, affecting the particular profession or occupation negatively.

The re-licensure provision of the licensing program ensures that an incentive is in place to make sure that licensees get relicensed prior to their expiration date and that the licensee maintains the required education and training during the licensure period.

The NH Department of Safety opposes this bill for the reasons stated.





House Executive Departments and Administration Committee

HB 1338, relative to failure to renew a professional or occupational license

Good afternoon, Madam Chair and members of the committee. My name is Leslie Melby I am the Vice President for State Government Relations with the New Hampshire Hospital Association, representing the state's 32 community and specialty hospitals.

We oppose HB 1338 which would eliminate the requirement to renew professional and occupational licenses. The New Hampshire Hospital Association supports licensure and/or certification of health professionals where unregulated practice presents a clear and present public danger, where there is no reasonable alternative to licensure/certification, and proposed licensure/certification requirements identify required competencies and provide an effective method for assuring proficiency.

HB 1338

POSITION: Opposed

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This bill would permit any licensee to renew his/her license regardless of how long it had lapsed.

The Department of Safety is opposed to this bill on many fronts. This will create a situation whereby licensees will renew their licenses only when it is convenient for them to do so. Most of the licensees regulated by the Department require some sort of continuing education component, which ensures that the licensee maintains a current minimum level of training in the licensed trade. This bill would negate that system and result in under-educated licensees.

This bill would also negatively affect the steady revenue stream which the Department uses to fund the administrative portion of the system where the licenses are reissued and also the field portion of the system consisting of the inspection and consultation services.

This industry itself will suffer immeasurable set backs as unlicensed and under-educated tradesmen will perform work, affecting the particular profession or occupation negatively.

The re-licensure provision of the licensing program ensures that an incentive is in place to make sure that licensees get relicensed prior to their expiration date and that the licensee maintains the required education and training during the licensure period.

The NH Department of Safety opposes this bill for the reasons stated.
