Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 County Employment; Hillsborough County. Amend RSA 28:10 to read as follows: 1 2 28:10 Employees, Counties. I. The commissioners of each county shall employ such number of clerks and agents as said 3 commissioners deem necessary. 4 II. In Hillsborough county the county [commissioner] commissioners, or any elected or 5 appointed official, prior to establishing any new position or eliminating any current position 6 within said county, shall obtain written approval from the Hillsborough county executive committee 7 [for such new position]. In addition, the Hillsborough county executive committee may by 8 majority vote of the executive committee establish a new position or eliminate a current 9 10 position within the county.

Testimony

Opposition to HB 1425, January 26, 2012

Good afternoon Madame Chairman. My name is Toni Pappas, Manchester. I am a Hillsborough County Commissioner and former NH State Legislator.

Today, I speak in opposition to HB 1425 because I believe this bill flies in the face of the checks and balances that are required to protect the smooth operation of County Government. As you know, among their many duties, County Commissioners and other elected officials are responsible for the establishment or elimination of County positions. Because they work closely with Department heads, Commissioners have a sense of what positions are needed to provide vital services to the County taxpayer.

In Hillsborough County new positions already require written approval by the Executive Committee. To give the Hillsborough County Executive Committee further power to create and eliminate positions would make it impossible for Commissioners to oversee the operation of Hillsborough County in an efficient manner.

Please consider that this bill will create a situation where the continued employment of every County employee is subject to the whim of a group of individuals from whom they do not take direction and to whom they do not report. Employees will have no idea of under what standards their work will be judged. In other words, they are being asked to serve two masters. This will have a chilling effect on County business and will make it impossible to retain and recruit good employees. No business, whether a government or a private industry, can operate successfully under such circumstances.

I believe branches of government are created to safeguard a balance of power. This bill has the potential to circumvent this balance so astutely designed into the framework of County government in NH. Political power should never be concentrated in the hands of one individual or group. Giving the Executive Committee a power normally executed by elected County officials is out of line and presents a danger to a system of County government that has worked well for many years.

I have to ask if this bill is intended to eliminate County government. I ask that you declare HB 1425 inexpedient to legislate. Thank you for your consideration.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

This bill attempts to modify the procedures for creating or eliminating new positions in the Hillsborough County Government. County Commissioners are responsible for creating a new position with the approval of the Executive Committee and they are equally responsible for eliminating positions when the workload or budget demands it. This bill would remove that authority to reduce positions from the Commissioners and require Executive Committee approval. This would upset the balance of power and place it at the top of the chain with the end result being that employees could no longer have confidence in their direct supervisors, the Commissioners, to retain their jobs. The Chain of Command should be observed in the workplace in assigning work and also in the creation or elimination of positions. Amendments were offered to correct deficiencies in this bill but did not achieve results acceptable to the committee that resulted in a unanimous bi-partisan vote to ITL this bill.
