HEARING DATE: March 20, 2012

MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE PRESENT: Senators Barnes, Forrester, Merrill, Boutin and Stiles.

MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ABSENT: No one

Sponsor(s): Representatives Shurtleff, D. Patten and Bettencourt.

What the bill does: establishes a committee to study the construction of a permanent memorial to Governor John Gilbert Winant on state property other than the state house grounds.

Who supports the bill: Representative Shurtleff

Who opposes the bill: No one.

Summary of testimony received:

•Senator Barnes opened the hearing at 9:15 am and introduced the prime sponsor, Representative Shurtleff, who gave a brief overview of Governor Winant's accomplishments.

•Having been born in New York City, John Winant attended St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire and returned some years later as an instructor, after graduating from Princeton University. In 1916 he was elected to the New Hampshire House. He was a captain in the Army Air Corps during World War I in France. After the war he returned to St. Paul's and was elected to the New Hampshire Senate in 1920. He was then elected to his first of three terms as Governor of New Hampshire in 1925.

- In 1935 President Franklin Roosevelt reached across the aisle and tapped Governor Winant as the first Director of the Social Security Administration. Winant then became Director of the International Labor Organization in Geneva, Switzerland in 1937. President Roosevelt then appointed Mr. Winant in 1941 as the US Ambassador to England, replacing Joseph Kennedy.

- In 1942 he received the Honor of Merit from the British government.

- Sadly in 1947, after having returned home to Concord he took his own life, worn out and drained by his years of service to state and country.

- Governor Winant has made tremendous contributions to our state and our nation. Recognition of his bipartisanship is long overdue.

- Senator Barnes sought to insure the Legislature would have oversight over construction of a memorial to Governor Winant. Representative Shurtleff assured Senator Barnes it would.

- A suggested location for the memorial is the State Library grounds. Senator Barnes wondered if the Legislature would make the final determination of the location. Representative Shurtleff stated it would.

- Senator Stiles inquired if Representative Shurtleff would be willing to volunteer for the committee. He indicated he would.

- Senator Merrill asked Representative Shurtleff if Governor Winant was the subject matter of a recent book. Representative Shurtleff indicated he was. "Citizens of London" describes Governor Winant's service to England during the war, and touches on other aspects of his life, including the consideration of Winant as a running mate for Governor Roosevelt in 1944.

- Senator Barnes closed the hearing at 9:26 am.

Action: Senator Merrill made a motion of Ought to Pass on HB 1134. Senator Stiles seconded the motion. The vote was 5-0 in favor. The committee then voted unanimously to place the bill on the Consent Calendar. Senator Merrill will report the bill out of committee.

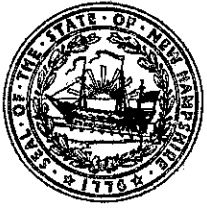


**COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PERMANENT

The Committee met on three occasions and received input from the Commissioners of Cultural Resources and Administrative Services and the New Hampshire Historical Society. A member of the Committee is in contact with the Winant family. Biographical information on Governor Winant and legislative enactments for memorials on the State House grounds were also reviewed. The members discussed coordinating an effort to fund and issue a request for proposals and how to reach potential artists who may be interested in offering their services.

The public-private partnership that the Committee is considering is still in development and we determined that our efforts need more time to reach fruition. We will respectfully request an extension until November, 2014 to complete our work. A legislative service request (LSR 2013-H-0017-R) has been submitted to accomplish this effort.
