RE: Hearing report on HCR 35 – designating Miss New Hampshire, of the Miss America Scholarship Program, the official honorary hostess of the state of New Hampshire during her term as Miss New Hampshire.

HEARING DATE: April 24, 2012

MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE PRESENT: Senators Barnes, Forrester, Merrill, Boutin and Stiles.

MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ABSENT: No one

Sponsor(s): Representatives Garcia, Griffin and Katsakiores.

What the bill does: designates Miss New Hampshire, of the Miss America Scholarship Program, the official honorary hostess of the state of New Hampshire during her term as Miss New Hampshire.

Who supports the bill: Representatives Garcia, Griffin, Baldasaro and Ladd; Regan Hartley, Megan Lyman, Samantha Massahos and Claudette Jolin, Miss New Hampshire Scholarship Program.

Who opposes the bill: No one

Summary of testimony received:

- Senator Barnes opened the hearing at 11:04 am and introduced the prime sponsor, Representative Garcia, who explained Miss New Hampshire is primarily a nonprofit scholarship program and not a beauty pageant. It is empowering and enriches young women, making them effective advocates for different causes.
- Ten other states have enacted such legislation, including Hawaii and Kentucky.
- The position is a ceremonial position. The bill does not require organizations to utilize the services of Miss New Hampshire as the official hostess.
- Senator Barnes wondered who holds the current title of hostess of our state. Is it the First Lady, Governor Lynch's wife, Susan?

• **Senator Merrill** asked if there was anything currently impeding Miss New Hampshire from attending certain events or doing things contemplated in this resolution. Representative Garcia indicated Miss New Hampshire attends various events but is not necessarily invited to functions, except in an official capacity. Organization officials develop Miss New Hampshire's schedule by seeking out appearance opportunities.

• **Representative Griffin** explained the Miss New Hampshire women are intelligent, as well evidenced by their academic performances. They are to be commended for their endeavors on behalf of the State of New Hampshire.

• **Regan Hartley**, the reigning Miss New Hampshire, testified the Miss America organization is a 501c3 volunteer scholarship program. No one in the organization gets paid for the work they do. The organization has been in existence for 91 years.

• It was founded as a bathing beauty contest in 1920, but has evolved into a scholarship organization highlighting community involvement.

• The responsibilities of Miss New Hampshire include being a goodwill ambassador for the Children's Miracle Network hospitals, serving as a spokesperson for the Miss America organization, promoting their own individual platform, and charitable community involvement.

• Being the official hostess for the state would add much creditability to the position of Miss New Hampshire. And it would be an honor for that individual as well.

• Ms. Hartley has won \$34,000 in scholarships during her participation with the program.

• Senator Merrill asked about other pageant programs in the state. Ms. Hartley indicated there are both a Miss New Hampshire USA and a Miss Teen New Hampshire USA. Those are the Donald Trump for-profit pageants, and do not award scholarships.

• **Claudette Jolin** is a co-Executive Director of the program. During last year's pageant the organization gave a total of \$89,000 to 27 women.

• This bill would provide a broader outlook for these young women to be seen, and to share their platforms.

• Senator Merrill noted the evolution of the pageant and asked if the program still includes a swimsuit competition. Ms. Jolin indicated it is now referred to as "Lifestyle and Fitness", and is still a requirement of the Miss America organization.

• **Megan Lyman**, Miss Lakes Region, has competed in the program for 6 years. She testified the program is always looking out for young women and their futures, and for those who want to better themselves. She has won \$23,000 in scholarships during her years competing in the program.

• **Samantha Massahos**, Miss Capital Area, has been competing for 4 years. She related her personal growth experience through her involvement with the organization. The program builds self-confidence for these young women. It is a remarkable, supportive program.

• **Senator Barnes** closed the hearing at 11:26 am.
