What the bill does: This bill authorizes the commissioner of the department of corrections to transfer funds within and among accounting units within the department for the efficient management of the department.

Who supports the bill: Senator Chuck Morse and Assistant Commissioner of the Department of Corrections, Bill McGonagle.

Who opposes the bill: No one appeared in opposition

Summary of testimony received:

Senator Morse: Prime Sponsor of the bill. The department is not asking to transfer funds. This request is in response to the \$6 million and \$7 million budget reduction, which is not business as usual, or a quick transfer of funds. The department needs the ability to move funds to have any change of meeting the budget reductions and to continue with the RFPs to privatize nursing, pharmacy and the sex offender treatment programs.

The \$75,000 transfer limit which was mentioned by the House when I originally put this legislation in would not help us address any of the transfers that would be required under the three RFPs, which is now 5. As an example, the nursing privatization RFP would require transferring over \$3 million in salaries and benefits to a contract expense line. Also in order to

do the transfer, the department would need a new contract expense class which we cannot do without legislation being passed.

With sex offender treatment program RFP, the department would additionally need to establish a new accounting unit also trying to transfer current Department of Correction's canteen, hobby craft, recreation staff, and other operating classes from general funds to other non-general funds. At the present, the department does not have the legal authority to effect these actions which have deemed appropriate and necessary to address the back of the budget reductions. It is my understanding that the Department of Health and Human Services has had this authority for several years and that the Administrative Services receive similar authority under HB 2.

This is probably the biggest budget that we cut. It was the only one added to. It also has three RFPs out there that I think could help State Government. And we probably could address that as we introduce those RFPs. I think it's a good place to go. It will help them and it only affects the budget. This ends at the end of 2013. This is just to help them through this session.

Senator Odell noted that in the bill that any changes it has to go through Fiscal Committee also, separate from the committee.

Assistant Commissioner William McGonagle: What I heard of Senator Morse's presentation we would agree with everything he said. We support this bill and would find the ability to transfer funds that would provide for the department a necessary set of tools for us to deal with our back of the budget cuts.

VICE-CHAIRMAN ODELL: We'll open the public hearing on Senate Bill 323 and invite Senator Morse to introduce his bill. Welcome, Senator Morse.

CHUCK MORSE, State Senator, Senate District #22:
Thank you, Senator Odell. I'm just going to read a response from Commissioner Wrenn. The House had -- had -- when I introduced this legislation, I had questions from the House and Commissioner Wrenn sent me a response, and I think it's appropriate to read it. And it will explain why we want to do this. There is legislation in the House which he alludes to that has been going through a process to help all departments, then there's explanation. I'll explain why it won't work for his.

We're not asking to transfer funds. We are also asking to create new accounting units and new expense classes. This request is in response to the \$6 million and \$7 million budget reduction which is not business as usual or a quick transfer of funds. We need the ability to move funds to have any chance of meeting the budget reductions and to continue with the RFPs to privatize nursing, pharmacy, and the sex offender treatment program, which was talked about earlier.

The \$75,000 transfer limit which was mentioned by the House when I originally put this legislation in would not help us address any of the transfers that would be required

under the three RFPs, which is actually five now. As an example, the nursing privatization RFP would require transferring over \$3 million in salaries and benefits to a contract expense line. Also, in order to do the transfer, we would need a new contract expense class which we cannot do without legislation being passed.

With the sex offender treatment program RFP, we would additionally need to establish a new accounting unit. We are also trying to transfer current Department of Corrections canteen, hobby craft, recreation staff, and other operating classes from general funds to other non-general funds. At the present, we do not have the legal authority to effect these actions which we have deemed appropriate and necessary to address the back-of-the-budget reductions. It is my understanding that the Department of Health and Human Services has had this authority for several years and that Administrative Services receives similar authority under HB2.

Normally, I would be against something like this. This is probably the biggest budget that we cut, and rightfully so, because it was the only one added to. And it also has three RFPs out there that I think could help State Government. And we probably could address this as we introduce those RFPs. But reality is, I think it's -- it's a good place to go, I think it will help them, and it only affects this budget. This ends at the end of 2013. And the next budget will be drafted in the manner that the group that puts it together will decide to do. So this is just to help them through this session.

SEN. MORSE: Okay.

VICE-CHAIRMAN ODELL: All right. Thank you.

<u>VICE-CHAIRMAN ODELL:</u> I'm in charge? All right. Questions? Seeing none. Thank you very much.

MR. MCGONAGLE: My pleasure.

VICE-CHAIRMAN ODELL: Appreciate you being here. Anyone else wishing to testify on Senate Bill 323? Seeing no one else, I will close the public hearing on Senate Bill 323.
