

Summary of testimony received:

Senator De Blois, Dist 18

- This bill was filed at the request of NH physicians. This will allow health care providers to bill for and receive direct reimbursement for their services.
- Currently, a policy holder settles a claim with the insurance company and compensation is sent to the policy holder so that he or she can pay the debt from the medical care. Sometimes, policy holders use the claim money for unrelated expenses and the healthcare professionals are either not paid in a timely manner or are not paid at all.
- This bill is modeled after a bill from last year declaring ambulance payments would be made in the same fashion.

Scott Colby, NH Medical Society

- The finances of professional medicine are becoming endangered, as the uncertainty of pay makes medicine a riskier business.
- This legislation will facilitate the billing process. Reimbursement is not happening all the time, even though it should be possible based on the insurance claim return.
- In response to questions from the Committee, Mr. Colby responded that there are industry safeguards to prevent double payment and if the process is run correctly this shouldn't be a concern.

Paula Rogers, Anthem Blue Cross/Blue Shield

- This legislation is very broad.
- Health care providers don't have a direct relationship with auto insurance carriers.
- It seems like the intent of this bill should be talking about Med Pay.
- This would ensure that places such as hospitals receive compensation for their work while not infringing on the rights of individuals.
- Contracts, which would be drafted for direct payment, are very useful for insurance companies, as they give an accurate assessment of costs, which is necessary for proper budgeting.

Deborah O'Loughlin, Department of Insurance

- Med Pay is limited to certain aspects of medical care. It does not cover the extra treatments in the medical community in most circumstances.
- The Department of Insurance would be willing to work with the committee to mold the bill to better suit the needs of both insurance companies and health care providers.
- In response to questions from the Committee, the witness responded that the funds that are not being reimbursed are relatively small amounts of money. The issue of contracts spans across many aspects of the healthcare system. This could have a far reaching influence for a relatively smaller issue.

Paula Minnehan, NH Hospital Association

- The situation has been getting worse, especially with the growing popularity of high deductible plans.
- Assignability used to be in place to help with the problem of selecting care methods and payment methods.

Jim Monahan, NH Chiropractic Association

• There is a similar bill in the House that refers specifically to chiropractors. This bill will facilitate payment from insurance companies to chiropractors when insurance covers such treatment.

Tyler Brannen, NH Department of Insurance

• The ambulance issue is a different issue. That is focused on contracts, not on Med Pay.
