Dear Chairman Chandley:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of HB 111, which would authorize the acquisition of an easement at the state-owned Akers Pond Dam in Errol that is needed to maintain the safety of the dam.

Akers Pond Dam is owned by the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFG). The main dam is a concrete spillway and outlet structure, which impounds Akers Pond. This main dam is on property that is owned by NHFG at the outlet of Akers Pond. The main dam was recently repaired by the Department of Environmental Services Dam Bureau (DES), which performs all major repair and reconstruction needed on any state-owned dams, as well as the daily operation and maintenance of dams owned by DES and NHFG.

Akers Pond Dam also includes an appurtenant structure, which consists of an earthen embankment, located on the east shoreline of Akers Pond just upstream of the main dam. This earthen embankment is overgrown with trees, which must be removed to prevent failure of the embankment and loss of the pond. The earthen embankment is located beyond the property that is owned by NHFG, and an easement is needed for the state to access this area and maintain the safety of the earthen embankment. The owner of the property, on which the earthen embankment is located, is willing to provide the necessary easement to NHFG. However, under RSA 482:44, no dam or any real property appurtenant to a dam or any rights and easements in either may be acquired without an act of the legislature which authorizes the acquisition of a particular dam, real property, or right or easement. For this reason, passage of this bill is required for NHFG to acquire the easement needed to maintain the earthen embankment at Akers Pond Dam in a safe condition.

In addition to Akers Pond Dam, DES has recently identified two other state-owned dams that also require the acquisition of additional easements to perform the necessary maintenance and repairs needed on their appurtenant structures. These dams are Northwood Lake Dam in Epsom and Hermit Lake Dam in Sanbornton. At both of these dams, easements are needed to repair and maintain earthen dikes associated with the dams. Both of these repair projects are scheduled to be performed in the next biennium. In order to allow for the repairs, DES requests that the bill be amended to provide DES the The Honorable Shannon Chandley, Chairman January 15, 2013 Page 2 of 2

legislative authorization needed to acquire the easements necessary to perform the required work. The proposed amended bill is attached.

The property rights the department of environmental services is authorized to acquire for the benefit of the state shall be exempt from taxation as long as the properties are held by the state. With the exception of such \$1 consideration, nothing in this paragraph shall mandate or authorize the expenditure of any funds or capital relative to the provisions of this paragraph.

Madam Chair and members of the Committee, for the record my name is Betsey McNaughten, I am a Land Agent for the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department. I'm representing the Department in support of HB 111, an act relative to the acquisition of property at Akers Pond dam in the town of Errol. The Fish and Game Commission voted unanimously to support this bill.

Akers Pond is a 276 acre great pond in the town of Errol, which has been raised by damming. The dam structure is made up of a concrete spillway structure, and a 400' dike embankment. In 1952, NHFG acquired a ½ acre parcel that included the concrete spillway, but did not include the 400' dike embankment.

The dam is classified as a low-hazard dam by the Department of Environmental Services Dam Safety Bureau, failure would cause major damage to a town road. The dike is part of the dam appurtenant works, and Akers Pond cannot be safely be impounded without it.

Under a 2011 Dam Safety Memorandum of Deficiency the Dam Bureau refaced the concrete spillway, abutments, reconstructed of the down stream bouldering & retaining wall and tree removed. The dike embankment still requires extensive reshaping, stump removal and rip-rap armoring on the upstream slope.

However, the dike is on private land owned by Clifford and Sharon Lane, and the state currently has no legal right to access the embankment on the Lane's property to complete the work. The Lanes have approved an Easement Deed for the maintenance and access rights to the dike in perpetuity.

"RSA 4:29 - ...No dam or any real property appurtenant thereto or any rights and easements in either may be acquired pursuant to the authority of this section or any other provision of law except an act of the legislature which authorizes the acquisition of a particular dam, real property, or right of easement."

In April 2012, NHDES received G&C approval to amend the completion date of the MOA with NHFG for the repairs at Ackers Pond Dam to June 30, 2015 so that the acquisition of the dike can work through the legislative process, and to allow time for permits-if applicable.

The Fish and Game Department urges you to vote HB 111 "Out to Pass".
