Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 School Meetings; Special Meetings. Amend RSA 197:2 to read as follows:

A special meeting of a school district shall be held whenever, in the 3 opinion of the school board *after consultation with the budget committee, if any,* there is 4 occasion therefor, or whenever 50 or more voters, or 1/4 of the voters of the district, whichever is less, 5 shall have made written application to the school board therefor, setting forth the subject matter 6 upon which action is desired. No special school district meeting shall be held in conjunction with the 7 biennial election, except when a special school district meeting has been approved by the court and a 8 school district has adopted the official ballot referendum form of meeting pursuant to RSA 40:14.

The 26 meeting shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. The most recently 27 updated checklist shall be used. In response to statutory changes resulting in reductions or increases in distribution of state revenues for education pursuant to RSA 198:41 to school districts, 11 the governing body of a city may call a special meeting of the legislative body to consider a reduction, 12 13rescission, or increase of appropriations made at an annual meeting. Hillsborough 20 – Litchfield

This bill was left over from last year. We received this bill toward the end of last years session. However, at the request of the DRA and NH School Board Association, it needed to be amended to include all towns and cities and not just SB2 towns. There was not enough time to do this, so we put the bill into interim study. The vote of the then Education Committee was to recommend that we bring it forward this year.

Over the past years we have had changes to the education funding formula, and the changes usually occurred after school districts have had their votes on the next year's budget. Two years ago, we changed the funding formula and I testified that we need to put into that law the ability for towns to hold a special meeting to either increase or decrease their spending because of the change. This has happened at least twice in the past 8 years.

It was then determined that we put into law, legislation to take care of this, in case in future years this was forgotten.

Also, the bill two years ago left what I considered a very important consideration, and that was the budget committee was not involved.

This bill allows for a budget committee if one exists to have a say in the budget changes.

Some may argue that there is not enough time for budget committee involvement, and of course the ones that say this do not want the budget committee to even be involved with the regular budget. For example, 2 years ago when the funding formula was changed, all the school districts knew about it, and could have easily planned their budget changes. But some school districts like my own decided to wait until the last minute to push it on the tax payers. Even though the law was passed and signed into law in June, our school board decided to take the month of July off, and not do anything about it until August. They wasted a whole month. So there is plenty of time for the budget committee.


