HOUSE BILL **310**

AN ACT relative to application of laws on employment to the members of the house of representatives.

ANALYSIS

This bill requires that the definition of employment in RSA 282-A:9 apply in all applications for the members of the house of representatives.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Application of Laws on Employment to Members of the House of
2 Representatives. Amend RSA 14 by inserting after section 15-b the following new section:

3 14:15-c Application of Laws on Employment to Members of the House of Representatives.
4 Notwithstanding any other law, the definition of employment in RSA 282-A:9, which excludes service
5 by the members of the house of representatives from the term "employment," shall govern all
6 matters of compensation and employment status for such members.

7 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
