Please accept this testimony on behalf of the Department of Resources and Economic Development, Division of Parks & Recreation, Bureau of Trails in <u>support of House Bill</u> 349.

This bill would authorize DRED to develop trails for and allow the use larger 4x4 vehicles at Jericho Mountain State Park. The development of trails for specialty vehicles such as jeeps and four wheel drive trucks was part of the Master Development Plan for Jericho Mountain State Park and is considered an area of need to address in NH.

Currently, there are no trails in NH for this type of off-road use and areas within Jericho are well suited to this type of recreation. The ability to develop specialty trails for this user group would increase attendance at the park and revenues derived from park operations. It would also create an additional recreational opportunity in support of growth of the tourism economy in the North Country. This bill would not allow the use of these larger vehicles on any other State Park property.






