In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Thirteen

AN ACT repealing the student tuition guaranty fund and making provisions for the disbursement of remaining funds, and relative to the membership of the higher education commission.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

SB 162-FN - FISCAL NOTE

AN ACT relative to licensing of postsecondary career schools.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Due to time constraints, the Office of Legislative Budget Assistant is unable to provide a fiscal note for this bill, as introduced, at this time. When completed, the fiscal note will be forwarded to the Senate Clerk's Office.

SB 162 FISCAL NOTE

AN ACT repealing the student tuition guaranty fund and making provisions for the disbursement of remaining funds, and relative to the membership of the higher education commission.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of Education states this bill, as amended by the Senate (Amendment #2013-0737s), will decrease state restricted revenues by \$40,000 in FY 2014 and each fiscal year thereafter, increase state general fund revenue by an indeterminable amount in FY 2014, and increase state restricted expenditures by \$370,000 in FY 2014. There will be no fiscal impact on county and local revenues or expenditures.

METHODOLOGY:

The Department of Education states this bill repeals the Department's authority to assess annual fees designated to fund the student tuition guaranty fund, eliminates the fund and makes provisions for the disbursement of the remaining funds. The Department states the student tuition guaranty fund currently holds a balance of approximately \$370,000 and receives approximately \$40,000 in annual restricted revenues derived from assessments made to career schools operating in the state. The Department states the proposed legislation's repeal of the Department's authority for the assessments will decrease state restricted revenues by approximately \$40,000 in FY 2014 and each fiscal year thereafter. The Department states the proposed legislation's provision to refund the balance of funds held in the student tuition guaranty fund to the schools responsible for contributing such funds will increase state restricted expenditures by \$370,000 in FY 2014. The Department also notes the proposed legislation designates interest earned on assessments held in the fund to be deposited into the state's general fund thereby increasing general fund revenue in FY 2014. However, the Department has not estimated what portion of the fund balance represents interest earned on assessments.



Per RSA 188-G, the Higher Education Commission is responsible for the private postsecondary career school function under the Division of Higher Education. Prior to registering or renewing a business or trade name, or soliciting students for enrollment, a career school maintaining a physical presence in this state shall be reviewed by the Commission to determine if the entity requires a license. The commission shall establish procedures to accomplish this review. The number of licensed career schools varies from 80 to 90 with the schools collecting nearly \$20,000,000 in revenue while serving more than 25,000 students. The fiscal year budgets are as follows: FY 2013 - \$149,636; FY 2014 - \$169,549; FY2015 - \$176,488. The annual licensure fees support the operation of the career school licensing function. These funds are non-lapsing.

Section I will repeal the student tuition guaranty fund and requires the Higher Education Commission to disburse all remaining funds to the private postsecondary career schools responsible for contributing to the fund. This fund is currently at \$394,375 and annual assessments bring in another \$27,000. This fund is non-lapsing.

Section II adds an additional member to the Higher Education Commission who represents the interests of private postsecondary career schools.

With schools being reimbursed the \$394,375, there will be no fiscal impact to the state.

Good Afternoon Committee Members

I apologize if I have to have someone read my testimony as the senate is in session and I need to be there to vote one of only 24.

For the record I am Nancy Stiles, Senator for District 24 consisting of 11 Seacoast area communities including New Castle, Rye, North Hampton, Hampton, Hampton Falls, Seabrook, Greenland, Stratham, Newton, Kensington and South Hampton.

Over the summer I met with members of the Career School Association listening to their concerns that the Career Schools are often not given the attention necessary because of the work load of the academic programs in DOE as well as difficulties in the application and approval process. After discussion we determined that they were more appropriately positioned under the Department of Employment Security. The stakeholders worked on that process which leads to the introduction of SB162-FN.

While both Commissioner Barry and Commissioner Copadis were in support of doing whatever the legislature determined appropriate at the senate hearing we heard from several Career Schools who were opposed to moving out of DOE.

As a result the bill was amended to repeal the student guarantee fund (which had no authority to dispense the money) and return the money to those Career Schools who had contributed to it and any interest gained (just over \$2,000) to the General Fund.

The amendment also added an extra Career School representative to the Higher Education Commission o make sure the voices of the Career Schools are heard.

Commission Barry is here to represent the department to answer questions.

I urge you to pass this legislation as amended.

TESTIMONY OF DR. RICHARD A. GUSTAFSON, DIRECTOR

DIVISION OF HIGHER EDUCATION – HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION

Thursday, April 18, 2013

I provide this written testimony in support of S.B. 162, which amends RSA 188-G to repeal the student tuition guaranty fund and to modify the membership of the Higher Education Commission to include two representatives from the career school community, from the present single representative.

Private postsecondary career schools provide an important educational service to the people of New Hampshire with short term educational programs which do not award degrees. The number of active career schools ranges between 80 and 90. Schools serve more than 25,000 students each year and have revenues of approximately \$20,000,000 annually.

For many years, oversight of the career schools was under the N.H. Postsecondary Education Commission (Commission) and the Commission included a dedicated position representing the career schools. The Commission was also responsible for rulemaking and the operation of career school licensure per RSA 188-G.

On July 1, 2011, the NH Postsecondary Education Commission was reorganized and downsized and administratively attached to the N.H. Department of Education, becoming the Division of Higher Education. The Commission's designation was changed to the Higher Education Commission.

For a time, the career school licensing function was transferred out of the Division of Higher Education into the Division of Career Technology and Adult Learning, Bureau of Career Development in the Department of Education. In September of 2012, the career school function was again placed in the Division of Higher Education, where it currently resides.

The career school licensing process has always been self-funded by annual licensure fees paid by the career schools. This licensure fund is non-lapsing. The office has two approved positions, pays modest overhead charges to the state and uses no General Funds.

Earlier in this legislative session, there was consideration for placing the career school function with another agency and establishing a small Career School Commission which would be responsible for establishing Administrative Rules and regulating the career school licensure functions. After considerable discussion, it was decided to have the regulation of private postsecondary career schools remain with the Division of Higher Education – Higher Education Commission, but to amend RSA 188-G as follows:

- Repeal the Student Tuition Guaranty Fund and provide for the disbursement of the funds back to the contributing schools. This was a fund established post-9/11 when career schools were unable to obtain performance bonds. The Fund has never been used and all are in support of this action.
- Provide for the addition of a second representative from the career school community to serve on the Higher Education Commission, appointed by the governor and council on the recommendation of the New Hampshire Council for Professional Education, an association of career schools.
- Include technical language corrections relative to surety bond indemnification.



This bill repeals the student tuition guaranty fund, which reimbursed students when the school they were attending failed, and requires the Higher Education Commission to disburse all remaining funds, to the private post-secondary career schools responsible for contributing the funds. The interest will go to the general fund.
