Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 0bligation to Bargain; Modification of Cost Items at Deliberative Session. Amend RSA 273-2 A:3, II(b) to read as follows:

3 (b) Only cost items shall be submitted to the legislative body of the public employer for 4 approval at the next annual meeting of the legislative body, unless there is an emergency as defined 5 in RSA 31:5 or RSA 197:3. [If the legislative body rejects any part of the submission, or while 6 accepting the submission takes any action which would result in a modification of the terms of the 7 cost item submitted to it, either party may reopen negotiations on all or part of the entire 8 agreement.] No cost item agreed to by the public employer and the employee organization 9 shall be modified by the legislative body of such public employer.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Obligation to Bargain; Modification of Cost Items in Negotiated Aggreements. Amend RSA 2 273-A:3, II(b) to read as follows:

(b) Only cost items shall be submitted to the legislative body of the public employer for approval at the next annual meeting of the legislative body, unless there is an emergency as defined in RSA 31:5 or RSA 197:3. If the legislative body rejects [any part of] the submission, or while accepting the submission takes any action which would result in a modification of the terms of the cost item submitted to it, either party may reopen negotiations on [all or part of] the entire agreement. No cost item agreed to by the public employer and the employee organization shall be modified by the legislative body of such public employer.

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

**HB** 187 -- An Act relative to cost items in negotiated agreements.

**Bill Analysis:** Provides that the dollar amount agreed to in a collective bargaining agreement between a public employer and an employee organization shall not be modified by the legislative body of the public employer.

#### **Sponsors:** Representative Porter

Who supports the bill: Representatives Porter, Belanger and Tatro; Dean Michener, NH School Boards Association.

#### Summary of testimony presented in support:

**Representative Porter:** 

- Town Moderators would regularly maintain the practice that when a collective bargaining agreement comes before the body, the dollar figure could not be changed. The reason given for this practice is because if the dollar figure changes, it essentially nullifies the collective bargaining agreement that was reached. This practice was in effect in the town of Hillsborough from 1987 until 2012.
- In March of 2012 the teachers and school board negotiated a new contract, but it was defeated. Negotiations resumed, a new agreement was reached, and because Hillsborough is a SB2 town, a special meeting was called.
- When the deliberative session for the special meeting was held, however, the Town Moderator changed his longstanding interpretation of the law, citing the advice of school district counsel. He advised voters the dollar amounts could be changed, but that the change would not be binding on either party, and the contract could be rejected by either party. Eventually, no changes were voted and the contract passed.
- Representative Porter researched the practices of other towns and found some moderators allowed changes, while others did not. To eliminate the confusion and make the practice uniform statewide, she filed the bill.

Dean Michener, NH School Boards Association:

• New Hampshire is a bit unique in negotiations. Generally, when two parties negotiate at the table and reach an agreement, there is closure.

But here in our state we require legislative body approval of those cost items. If you have modification of any terms of the agreement between the two parties, the effect of that is to send the two parties back to the table. Any changes that might be made, either at the legislative body or the deliberative session, i.e., a change to the cost items, sends a message. But the impact of that action is to return to negotiations. Unless you are actually sitting at the table, you are not aware of the full scope of those negotiations.

- The locally elected school board is the representative of the community and is responsible for doing the negotiations. The terms of that agreement should be the ones presented to the legislative body for their consideration and ultimate vote.
- This becomes even more of an issue with SB2 towns because of the deliberative session.

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Action: The committee voted unanimously to pass HB 187.
