 - (3) There were no extenuating circumstances that could justify the act.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Rep. Rosenwald

- In 2009, HB 592 was introduced to require hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers to report six broad categories of incidents that should never happen.
- The incidents that were included were compiled from the National Quality Forum. There reporting criteria are used by 30 different states.
- The 2009 bill required any facility that reported one of the incidents to conduct a root cause analysis, plan for corrective action, and report to HHS. Then HHS has to put out an annual report.
- The reporting is good for the public and leads to increased public safety.
- HB 293 updates the 2009 adverse events reporting law.
- The national quality forum has updated their list of adverse events. By referencing the national quality forum instead of listing the specific events in the bill it will prevent changing the statute whenever the national quality forum updates their list.
- It also, includes a situation like what happened with Exeter hospital. In lines 16-20, "the transmission of non-aerosolized bloodborne pathogen by a health care worker's intentional, unsafe act."

- The hospital association is in full support of the bill
- In response to questions from the committee Rep. Rosenwald stated:
 - o Fifteen days should be enough time to report because these are things that should never happen. The fifteen days is the current law.

Rep. Harding:

• The house changed the language to include the intent to transfer a disease even if it does not result a transfer of the disease.

Leslie Melby: NH Hospital Association

- This is a bill that improves upon an already successful statute.
- The bill replaces the current list of adverse events with the list from the national quality forum. The list is subject to change over time and they believe it is appropriate to reference the national quality forum
- It also includes the transmission of a bloodborne pathogen by an intentional unsafe act.
- In response to questions from the committee Ms. Melby stated:
 - o She believes an unintentional safe act would be a reportable event.

Scott Goodwin: NH healthcare quality assurance commission

- The NH healthcare quality assurance commission supports HB 293
- The changes represent an important step in eliminating serious preventable harm to patients.
- The bill provides meaningful guidance to the members of NH healthcare quality insurance commission.
- In response to questions from the committee Mr. Goodwin stated:
 - The bill deals with an intentional unsafe act or an act relating in an infection disease that includes an intentional act or reckless behavior.
 We have process to evaluate reckless behavior.

Kate Frey: DHHS

• The current statutes include accidents that are unintentional. Such as, surgery performed on the wrong patient or the wrong side. The intent of adding lines 16-20 is to address what happened in Exeter over the summer.
