ANALYSIS

This bill provides that the superior court and circuit court shall not appoint a bail commissioner whose appointment would present a conflict of interest or appearance of bias.

The bill is a request of the supreme court.

Bill Analysis: This bill provides that the Superior Court and Circuit Court shall not appoint a bail commissioner whose appointment would present a conflict of interest or appearance of bias and was requested by the Supreme Court.

Sponsors: Senator Cataldo

Who supports the bill: Senator Cataldo; The Honorable David King, Deputy Administrative Judge of the Circuit Courts; Attorney Howard Zibel, Judicial Legal Counsel

Who opposes the bill: No one

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Senator Cataldo

• Explained that the purpose of the Superior and Circuit Courts is to not appoint bail commissioners who have a conflict of interest.

Attorney Zibel

• Gave background on how the courts come up with legislative proposals: they have a Legislative Committee that meets solely via e-mail and ideas are brought forward throughout the year. The ideas are written up and given to the Administrative Council members (Don Goodnow, Judge Nadeau, Judges King and Kelly) and they make a recommendation to the Supreme Court. Each member of the Supreme Court votes on whether to bring the ideas forward. He said that the Courts do not seek political sponsors of their legislative ideas, but instead ask for courtesy sponsors who are typically the chairpersons of the Senate and House Judiciary Committees. • On this particular bill, the idea came from the Circuit Court. Judge King

- Explained that the bill does two things:
 - Changes the court name from District Court to Circuit Court to be consistent with changes made previously;
 - And clarifies that when an appointment of a bail commissioner is made, there be no conflict of interest.
- The purpose of bail is to accomplish two things: first to make sure that the individual accused shows up in court for their hearing; and second, to protect the public.
- He used the example of someone who works for a police department (i.e., a police dispatcher who also happens to be a bail commissioner) would have the appearance of a conflict of interest and representing the police.
- The intent to is remove no one currently serving as a bail commissioner, but when their term comes up, not renew them if the conflict is still in place.

Attorney Zibel

• Two sections no longer needed in statute are removed in the bill in the repeal section.

Summary of testimony presented in opposition:


