FINAL REPORT

The above-named Legislative Study Committee studied the issues relative to developing a policy for veteran preference for government hiring and extending the commission on the effects of service-connected post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury.

FINDINGS

The first meeting was held on August 7, 2013 at 10 a.m.

The members of the committee nominated and voted Senator Sharon Carson as chair of the committee and Representative Linda Lauer was appointed clerk.

Senator Carson will be filing legislation making the Commission on the Effects of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injury permanent.

She also discussed the reason for the potential filing of legislation on Veterans Preference. A constituent had inquired why the State did not have a statewide veteran's preference policy. Upon research, it was discovered that there were some preferences, but they varied from department to department.

At the next meeting of the study committee, representatives from a number of organizations were called in to provide the committee with information relating to veteran's preference in hiring.

The second meeting was held August 28, 2013. Presentations were made to the committee by Karen Hutchins, Division of Personnel, Mary Morin, Director, NH Office of Veterans Services, Dennis Viola, State Director, US Department of Labor Veterans Employment and Training, Commissioner George Copadis, Department of Employment Security, Commissioner James Craig, Department of Labor, and Pamela Szacik, Employment Services Bureau Director, NH Employment Security.

The committee also heard testimony that many state agencies have their own hiring practices and agreed that it might be appropriate to ensure consistency across the different government branches. Those that do would like to be able to piggy back onto the federal guidelines. The committee agreed that they should look into the federal system and compare to current state practices. Senator Carson contacted the Judicial Branch and Senator D'Allesandro requested information concerning the hiring practices of the Legislative Branch.

At the next scheduled meeting held on September 17, 2013, Senator Carson informed the committee members that the Judicial Branch did not have a veteran's preference hiring system. The committee also discussed the importance that any language brought forward for legislation must state a veteran must be qualified for a position first, prior to being eligible for the preference. The final meeting for the study committee was held on October 24, 2013. The minutes from the September 17th meeting were reviewed and accepted by the committee.

The October 24th meeting was held so that Committee members could review the "Draft" Final Report, which included the Committee Findings and Recommendations, potential legislative language for a permanent commission on post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury, in addition to draft legislation for Veteran's Preference.

All was reviewed with some additions in the draft language which will be submitted to the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) for legislation in 2014. The Final Report on SB 90 will be submitted as required by legislation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Senator Carson will be filing legislation making the Commission on the Effects of post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury a permanent commission.
- 2. Legislation will be filed for Veteran's Preference by Senator Carson.
