ANALYSIS

This bill grants the retirement system authority to establish electronic access to vital records data on deaths, marriages, and divorces held by the division of vital records administration for the purposes of the administration of RSA 100-A.

This bill is a request of the New Hampshire retirement system.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fourteen

AN ACT

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permitting the retirement system to access death, marriage, and divorce records of the division of vital records administration for the administration of RSA 100-A.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Vital Records Administration; Privacy. Amend RSA 5-C:4, II to read as follows:

II. In collecting information, prime consideration shall be given to the protection of the privacy of the individuals about whom information is given. In accordance with the provisions of this chapter, the secretary of state shall ensure that, when information is collected, the minimum of data shall be collected to accomplish a specific purpose, that no information shall be available to unauthorized personnel, that only the minimum be made available to authorized personnel, and that no information that could possibly adversely affect an identified individual be made public. The department of health and human services shall have access to vital records information in accordance with the provisions of RSA 126:24-c. The New Hampshire retirement system shall have access to vital records information in accordance with the provisions of RSA 100-A:14, XVI.

2 New Paragraph; Vital Records; Disclosure of Information. Amend RSA 5-C:9 by inserting after paragraph VII the following new paragraph:

VIII. The New Hampshire retirement system shall have a direct and tangible interest in death, marriage, and divorce records information used for the purposes of the administration of RSA 100-A, including names of registrants, dates of birth, places of birth, social security numbers, dates of vital events, places of vital events, marrial status, and the names of spouses.

3 New Paragraph; Retirement System Administration. Amend RSA 100-A:14 by inserting after paragraph XV the following new paragraph:

XVI. The retirement system shall have a direct and tangible interest in death, marriage, and divorce records information including names of registrants, dates of birth, places of birth, social security numbers, dates of vital events, places of vital events, marital status, and the names of spouses.

4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

HB 1617-FN - FISCAL NOTE

AN ACT

permitting the retirement system to access death, marriage, and divorce records of the division of vital records administration for the administration of RSA 100-A.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of State states this bill, <u>as introduced</u>, may increase state expenditures by an indeterminable amount in FY 2015 only. There will be no impact on county and local expenditures, or state, county, and local revenue.

METHODOLOGY:

The Department of State states this bill will recognize the New Hampshire Retirement System as having a direct and tangible interest in death, marriage, and divorce records of Retirement System members maintained by the Department's Division of Vital Records. This designation will permit the Retirement System to have access to those specific records. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) already accesses this information through the Enterprise Data Warehouse (EDW) maintained by DHHS. If the Retirement System is permitted to access this data through the EDW, there will be no expenditures required by the Department of State. If, however, separate access must be established, the Department estimates it will incur a one-time expenditure of approximately \$50,000 to purchase a server and have a vendor write the application.

The Department of Health and Human Services and the New Hampshire Retirement System state this bill will have no fiscal impact.

The New Hampshire retirement system shall have a direct and tangible interest in a limited data set of death, marriage and divorce information of members and beneficiaries for purposes of administering RSA 100-A, limited to name of registrant, date of birth, place of birth, social security number, date of vital event, place of vital event, marital status, and name of spouse. The secretary of state and the executive director of the New Hampshire retirement system shall enter into a memorandum of understanding for the purposes of delineating specific procedures for access to this limited data set.
- 3 New Paragraph; Retirement System Administration. Amend RSA 100-A:14 by inserting after paragraph XV the following new paragraph:
- XVI. Access to Information From Vital Records for Retirement System Purposes. The retirement system shall have a direct and tangible interest in death, marriage, and divorce vital records information of members and beneficiaries, limited to name of registrant, date of birth, place of birth, social security number, date of vital event, place of vital event, marital status, and name of spouse. The secretary of state and the executive director of the New Hampshire retirement system shall enter into a memorandum of understanding for the purposes of delineating specific procedures for access to this limited data set.

Representative Gagnon presented the bill and stated that the bill was submitted at the request of the NHRS. This bill allows the NHRS to access the death, marriage and divorce records of retirees. Representative Gagnon presented an amendment to the bill #2014-0144h (see attached).

Representative Schuett, Merr 20

Representative Schuett stated that she supports the bill.

*Mr. Marty Karlon representing the New Hampshire Retirement System

Mr. Karlon provided written testimony (see attached) and stated that NHRS supports the legislation. Mr. Karlon stated that this bill would allow for the NHRS to process deaths and changes to the retirement system more expeditiously. Mr. Karlon summarized the differences between the original bill and the amendment. Mr. Karlon stated that today, NHRS searches through obituaries printed in the papers for retiree deaths. Mr. Karlon addressed several questions from the committee. He stated that there are about 30 cases per month where the retiree

dies and NHRS sends out a benefit check as they do not know of the death.

Mr. Stephen Wurtz, Director of the NH Division of Vital Records

Mr. Wurtz stated that he supports the bill amendment presented to the committee. Mr. Wurtz stated that under statue, vital records are not considered public records but are confidential. Mr. Wurtz related that DHHS has access to vital records as there is statue that authorizes their access and went on to say that he has denied access to NHRS as there is no supporting statue authorizing them access. Mr. Wurtz suggested that NHRS obtain legislation authorizing access and that this information be of a limited nature. He stated that as the vital records are stored electronically, they can limit access by NHRS to particular data elements that are authorized in the legislation. Mr. Wurtz answered several questions of the committee. Mr. Wurtz expressed that the parameters of the access methodology by NHRS would be spelled out between his department and NHRS though a Memorandum of Understanding.

NHRS Bill Brief: House Bill 1617 (as introduced)

Summary: "An act permitting the retirement system to access death, marriage, and divorce records of the division of vital records administration for the administration of RSA 100-A."

Analysis: "This bill grants the retirement system authority to establish electronic access to vital records data on deaths, marriages, and divorces held by the division of vital records administration for the purposes of the administration of RSA 100-A."

Sponsors: Rep. Gagnon, Sull 5; Rep. Schuett, Merr 20; Sen. Odell, Dist 8.

Background

The New Hampshire Retirement System (NHRS, the retirement system) pays out lifetime pension annuities to retired members and, in cases where a survivorship option is chosen, their designated beneficiary(ies). NHRS takes several steps to actively monitor deaths of retirees, beneficiaries and members; however, there are instances in which benefits are paid after the death of an annuitant and must be recouped. In addition, some NHRS benefits are contingent on the marital status of a retiree/beneficiary, so providing the retirement system with access to marriage and divorce records in cases where these records are unavailable from other sources will improve NHRS' ability to effectively administer benefits.

Because more than 80 percent of NHRS retirees live in-state, providing the retirement system with strictly limited access to specific state vital records of retired members and beneficiaries will allow NHRS to verify life events that may impact benefits in a timely manner.

Other Considerations

- -- NHRS has had multiple meetings with representatives of the Secretary of State's office and the Division of Vital Records to refine the language in this bill. The Division of Vital Records has strict protocols for accessing vital records and if this legislation is adopted, NHRS will work with the Secretary of State's office to develop a memorandum of understanding delineating specific procedures for access to this limited data set.
- -- This bill was based on an existing statutory provision (RSA 5-C:9, VI) providing the Department of Health and Human Services with similar access to vital records.
