Rep. Butler, Carr 7

- This bill is designed to study the lodging aspect of peer to peer lodging sites. There are about 640 airbnb locations in NH. We should look into how the rooms and meals tax should apply to these situations and does the playing field need leveling.
- Senator Bradley suggested an amendment changing the membership to 1 Senator and 4 Representatives.

Mike Somers, NH Lodging & Restaurant Association

- We need to look at potentially leveling the playing field between peer to peer lodging and traditional lodging.
- Senator Pierce raised the option of combining this study with a Senate Bill that plans to study the issue of peer to peer transportation sites.
- The witness said that would be fine but it would create a large study and this is an important issue for the lodging industry and he wouldn't want to see either study loosing focus.
