This bill allows for the regulation of electrical installations done without compensation, authorizes voluntary inspection fees and identification of inspectors, and updates the National Electrical Code in the state building code.

AN ACT relative to the regulation of electricians.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1       1 Electricians; Regulation. Amend RSA 319-C:1 to read as follows:

2       319-C:1 Electricians. No electrical installation shall be made [~~for compensation~~], unless made  
3 by an electrician or other person licensed by the electricians' board, except as provided in this  
4 chapter.

5       2 New Paragraph; Electricians; Inspectors; Identification. Amend RSA 319-C:5 by inserting  
6 after paragraph IV the following new paragraph:

7           V. A city or town building official or code enforcement officer designated by the  
8 administrative authority of the city or town, shall have the authority to check the license or  
9 identification issued under this chapter to an inspector.

10       3 Electricians; Fees for Voluntary Inspections. Amend RSA 319-C:6-b to read as follows:

11       319-C:6-b Fees. The board shall establish application fees for examination of applicants, fees for  
12 licensure, for renewal, and for late renewal of licenses to practice under this chapter, [~~and~~] for  
13 transcribing and transferring records, *for voluntary inspections done by an inspector under*  
14 *RSA 319-C:5*, and other services. The fee for examination shall not include fees charged by and  
15 paid to an examination entity approved by the board. The fees established by the board shall be  
16 sufficient to produce estimated revenues equal to 125 percent of the direct operating expenses of the  
17 board budgeted for the biennium in which they will apply. Fees collected shall be deposited in the  
18 general fund as unrestricted revenue.

19       4 State Building Code; National Electrical Code. Amend RSA 155-A:1, IV to read as follows:

20           IV. "New Hampshire building code" or "state building code" means the adoption by  
21 reference of the International Building Code 2009, the International Existing Building Code 2009,  
22 the International Plumbing Code 2009, the International Mechanical Code 2009, the International  
23 Energy Conservation Code 2009, and the International Residential Code 2009, as published by the  
24 International Code Council, and the National Electrical Code [~~2014~~] **2017**, as amended by the state  
25 building code review board and ratified by the legislature in accordance with RSA 155-A:10. The  
26 provisions of any other national code or model code referred to within a code listed in this definition  
27 shall not be included in the state building code unless specifically included in the codes listed in this  
28 definition.

29       5 Effective Date.

30           I. Section 4 of this act shall take effect January 1, 2018.

31           II. The remainder of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

**METHODOLOGY:**

This bill would require electrical installations, whether for compensation or not, to be made by electricians or other persons licensed by the Electrician's Board. It allows for the establishment of fees for voluntary inspections done by a Board appointed inspector and updates a reference to the National Electrical Code within the State Building Code. City or town building officials or code enforcement officers shall have the authority to check the license or identification of inspectors. The Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) estimates the number of voluntary inspections requested would be minimal, but there would be costs associated with fueling State-owned vehicles traveling to the locations. The fee to be determined by the Board of Electricians is unknown but would increase OPLC unrestricted revenue. The New Hampshire Municipal Association indicates it is unlikely to affect municipal revenues or expenditures.

**METHODOLOGY:**

This bill as amended specifies who has authority to identify licensed electrical inspectors. The Electrician's Board would be required to adopt rules regarding "third party electrical inspections". The authority for the State Fire Marshal to enforce electrician regulations has been removed. It updates a reference to the National Electrical Code within the State Building Code. City or town building officials or code enforcement officers shall have the authority to check the license or identification of inspectors. The Department of Safety indicates a few licensing inspectors on the joint board will take on the responsibility for electrical licensing violations from many jurisdictions, impacting enforcement of electrical safety throughout the State. The fiscal impact is unknown because of how many licensing violations handled locally would become additional work for the joint board.

The Office of Professional Licensure and Certification indicates there is no fiscal impact.

**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

**Senator D'Allesandro, prime sponsor** supplied a letter to Committee members from Peter Cicolini, Chairman of the Electricians' Board in support of this legislation and also brought forward an amendment to the bill (Amendment #0216s).

- Proposes several changes to RSA 319-C
- The bill, as proposed, strikes "for compensation" from RSA 319-C:1.
- This is brought in because there are some people who believe they do not need to be licensed by the Board if installing electrical installations outside of their own home, provided they do not charge.
- Change is to eliminate risks posed to the public, by requiring an electrical license for all installations, except those explicitly identified in statute as exempt.
- It does not eliminate homeowners exemption (RSA 319-C:15 II).
- The addition of RSA 319-C:5 V, in the original bill, clarified in the proposed amendment, allows an official, appointed by a city or town, to verify that a person performing electrical installations is properly licensed. Currently, there is no

statutory authority granting that ability.

- As found in the amendment, RSA 319-C:5, permits a third party electrical inspector to perform electrical inspections allowing entities who need a third party inspection, without additional fee from the Board, to choose from a list of approved inspectors maintained by the Board.
- This bill adopts the most “current version” of the National Electrical Code, RSA 155-A:1 IV, which imposes the most up-to-date safety protocols on electrical installation practices.
- The adoption of the 2017 National Electric Code, effective January 1, 2018, will permit time to educate and train on new codes.

**Dean Sotirakopoulos, Chief Electrical Inspector, Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (in support):**

**Steven Rancourt, Pelham, New Hampshire, Licensed Electrician, representing the Electrical Contractors Business Association (ECBA) (in support) (requesting additional change to the bill – amendment provided):**

- Offering another amendment to the bill, which applies to a different section.
- RSA 319-C:7 III is presently confusing and this language clarifies. The addition of, “to any electrical inspector appointed under this chapter...”
- This has to do with people checking licenses. Gives authority for a state electrical inspector to check your license, but before this change, it was not defined.
- The Chairman of the Electricians’ Board was made aware of this change, and was okay with the change.
- Hoping it is a simple amendment for the committee to accept.

**Senator Carson** asked Mr. Rancourt if he had a copy of the new electrical code. Mr. Rancourt asked if she was looking for the 2017. **Senator Carson** stated yes. He did not have one with him. **Senator Carson** asked for one so that the committee could read and see what exactly was in this code. Mr. Rancourt stated, “Sure”. **Senator Carson** asked for this as soon as possible.

## SB 135 Narrative

This bill and its amendment propose several changes to RSA 319-C. First, the bill as proposed strikes the words “for compensation” from RSA 319-C:1. Under the current version of this law, some people believe that they do not need to be licensed by the board if they are performing electrical installations outside their own home provided they do so free of charge. The change seeks to eliminate the risks posed to the public by such practices by requiring an electrical license for all installations except those explicitly identified in statute as being exempt. It does not eliminate the “homeowner’s exception” found in RSA 319-C:15, II; under that exception a homeowner may make electrical installations to a single family residence owned and occupied by the homeowner as a bona fide personal abode.

Second, the addition of RSA 319-C:5, V, found in the original bill and clarified in the amendment, would allow an official appointed by a city or town to verify that a person performing electrical installations in their city or town is properly licensed, as there is not currently any explicit statutory authority granting them that ability.

Third, the addition of RSA 319-C:5-a as found in the amendment to the bill, would permit a third party electrical inspector to perform electrical inspections, and would allow entities needing a third party inspection without additional fee from the board to choose from the list of approved inspectors maintained by the board.

Finally, the bill adopts the most current version of the National Electrical Code in RSA 155-A:1, IV, which will not only allow licensed electricians to use the latest products and technology, but also imposes the most up to date safety protocols on electrical installation practice. The adoption of the 2017 National Electrical Code effective January 1, 2018, will permit licensees time to educate and train themselves on the code’s new provisions, and will provide all consumers of electricity within the State of New Hampshire the safest and most efficient installations possible.

Honorable Senator Sharon Carson, Chair and Committee members, I would like to offer the following amendment for SB135 --- please amend RSA 319-C:7-III by adding the wording in bold below.

The reason for this amendment is to clarify, in this section, who is permitted to check an electrician's license issued by the Electricians' Board.

Licensing Requirements. Amend RSA 319-C:7 III to read as follows

319-C:7 Licensing Requirements. -

I. [Repealed.]

II. After June 30, 1976, the board shall issue a license as a master or journeyman electrician to any person who files an application and meets the following qualifications:

(a) Completion of 8,000 hours of service as an apprentice electrician. The board may give credit toward such service for the satisfactory completion of a course of instruction in the field at a school recognized by the board; and

(b) Satisfactory passing of an examination conducted by said board as provided in RSA 319-C:8 to determine his fitness to receive such license.

II-a. The board shall issue a license as a high/medium voltage electrician to any person who files an application and meets the following qualifications:

(a) Shows proof of successfully completing a state, national, or employer certification program approved by the board or;

(b) Prior to January 1, 2003, shows proof of having been employed for a minimum of 5 years as a high/medium voltage electrician working for a company with an approved training program.

III. All persons licensed by the board shall receive a certificate under the seal of the board and with the signature of the board chairman, which must be publicly displayed at the principal place of business of said electrician, or, if no such place of business, must be carried on his person and displayed at any time upon request, **to any electrical inspector appointed under this chapter**, as long as said person continues in the business as herein defined. The certificate shall specify the name of the person licensed who, in the case of a firm, shall be one of its members or employees and, in the case of a corporation, one of its officers or employees passing the examination. In the case of a firm or corporation, the license shall be void upon the death of or the severance from the company of said person.


Dear Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:
