Amend RSA 100-A:22, II(b) as inserted by section 1 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

(b) School districts may, on or before December 31, 2018, by action of their governing body, exempt their superintendent of schools, at the time of initial hiring or appointment, from compulsory membership provided herein. If such exemption is adopted, a superintendent of schools who was enrolled as a member in the retirement system within the 2-year period preceding the effective date of this subparagraph may make a request to the school district governing body to withdraw from membership. Upon approval of a withdrawal from membership and notice provided to the retirement system, a superintendent who ceases to be a member of the retirement system shall not be permitted to re-enroll as a member for as long as he or she holds the same position. If the school district exempts the superintendent of schools from compulsory membership in the retirement system, the school district shall pay to the retirement system, for deposit in the state annuity accumulation fund, an unfunded accrued liability payment calculated as an equivalent percentage determined under RSA 100-A:16, II(e) applied to the compensation paid for the superintendent of schools position.

Rep. Lisa Freeman, Hillsborough District 12, Prime sponsor. - Introduced and explained the bill. She said the bill is needed to attract candidates for superintendents' positions. Some applicants to these positions neither need nor want to contribute to the NHRS. She indicated that some come to the job with a previously established retirement account.

<u>Marty Karlan, Public Information Officer for the NH Retirement System</u> - informational speaker.

The retirement system does not have a position on this bill as introduced. It would create a new category in the retirement system for school superintendents. This is similar to what was done for town administrators in the 1970's. Other similar groups were grandfathered.

There are 100-150 retirees working in positions such as this. This would allow our superintendents to retire and then go back to work in another similar position.

Under state law if a member wanted to get contributions is to terminate employment.

If a superintendent is currently working in a full time position, s/he is currently in a contributing position. If that person opts out of the retirement system, there is some "undefinable" and "incalculable" cost. There are currently 104 superintendents in positions contributing to the NH Retirement System.

The portion of the unaccrued actuarial liability would not be refunded to the NHRS if the superintendent opts out of participation.

Under this bill the superintendent would not be mandated to work 32 hours as is typical when a retiree collecting retirement contributions. It would be as if it were not a retirement system job at all.

If a superintendent terminates employment s/he is entitled to take his/her contributions along with the interest on those contributions. They can take these, they can role these into a different fund or they can leave them with the NHRS.

The employer portion contributes (up to 70% of employer contributions) is dedicated to the unfunded acrued liability. This is not paid if the superintendent applicant opts out of participation in the NHRS.

Arthur Beaudry, representing himself as a member of the Manchester School Board - in support.

This bill was put in because of the superintendent in Manchester. They have gone through 6 superintendents in 17 years. The past two superintendents had contracts that contained a provision that allowed the superintendent to opt out of the NHRS.

The current superintendent actually decided to opt out as he had a retirement account from NY. When they applied to the NHRS for this exemption, they were denied. State law disallowed the exemption or ability to opt out. As a result, the current superintendent is enrolled in the NHRS because that exemption was not allowed.

He says that this is in no way an attempt to double-dip. He says this might be strengthened in the bill.

Germano Martins, speaking as a taxpayer, he is also a member of the NHRS – but he is not speaking on behalf of the NHRS.-.opposes bill.

He feels that if an employee goes into an otherwise contributing position and opts out, he sees the cost of this being spread out to others.

He feels this bill will lead to double-dipping and to higher costs and lower contributions to the unfunded accrued liability.

He says the employee loses nothing because they are able to collect their contributions with interest.

He says there is a way to calculate the costs of not contributing to the UAAL but this formula is not being used.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill allows school districts, by action of their governing bodies, to exempt their superintendent of schools, at the time of initial hiring or appointment, from compulsory membership in the New Hampshire Retirement System (NHRS). Upon approval of such exemption, a superintendent of schools who was enrolled as a member in the NHRS within the 2 year period preceding the effective date of this bill may make a request to the governing body to withdraw from such membership. A superintendent who ceases to be a member of the NHRS shall not be permitted to re-enroll as a member for as long as he or she holds the same position with such employer.

The Department of Education states that superintendents are Group I employees and the total compensation paid for superintendents statewide for 2017-2018 was \$11,400,648.64, excluding 2 superintendents whom are paid an hourly rate. The Group I employer rate for employees in effect through June 30, 2019 is 11.08%. Assuming that all superintendents would be exempt from the NHRS, there would be a reduction in local expenditures of \$1,263,191.87 (11.08% x \$11,400,648.64).

The NHRS states the local expenditure is indeterminable since the changes are expected to

have a small impact on the actuarial status of the system and employer contribution rates (i.e. increase of less than .01% of payroll). Each superintendent removed will reduce the covered payroll used to amortize the unfunded accrued liability, and therefore, increase the amortization rate. The System states it will need to make an estimated \$2,664 change to the Pension Gold software.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Retirement System; Exemption from Membership; Certain School Officials. Amend RSA 100-A:22 to read as follows:

100-A:22 Modifications.

- I. Membership in the retirement system shall be optional for officers and employees of the employer who are in the service of the employer on the date when participation becomes effective, and any such officer or employee who elects to join the retirement system within one year thereafter shall be credited with prior service covering such periods of prior service rendered to such employer for which the employer is willing to make accrued liability contributions. If the employer is unable or unwilling to make such contributions, a member in service may petition the board of trustees for periods of prior service rendered to such employer. Upon payment by the member of the amount determined in accordance with RSA 100-A:3, VI(b) and with the approval of the board, the member shall receive credit for such prior service. Thereafter, service for such employer on account of which contributions are made by the employer and member shall also be considered as creditable service. However, in no event shall prior service purchased as creditable service under this section be used as creditable service for the purpose of eligibility for medical benefits under RSA 100-A:52, RSA 100-A:52-a, or RSA 100-A:52-b.
- II. Membership shall be compulsory for all employees entering the service of such employer after the date participation becomes effective. Except that:
- (a) Municipalities may, by action of their city council or board of selectmen, exempt their chief administrative officer, at the time of initial hiring or appointment, from compulsory membership provided herein. The chief fiscal officer of the employer, and the heads of its departments, shall submit to the board of trustees such information and shall cause to be performed with respect to the employees of such employer, who are members of the retirement system, such duties as shall be prescribed by the trustees in order to carry out the provisions of this chapter.
- (b) School districts may, by action of their governing body, exempt their superintendent of schools, at the time of initial hiring or appointment, from compulsory membership provided herein.
