Rick Naya, Executive Director of National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws, (NORML) -

Liberties are being taken from us by allowing monopolies of producers. Other companies should be allowed to compete, driving prices down.

Brett Sicklick, Prime Alternative Treatment Center - Opposes the bill -

Patient base has increased but four producers have been able to expand within their footprints. Costs have come down significantly without any additional producers, by being able to take advantage of economies of scale and as a result of realizing returns on investments. Lower costs by not having to start from scratch (paraphrased). Adding another operator and reducing patient base will add challenges to the dispensaries without advantage to the patients. Expansion of patient base is attributable to the increased number of qualifying conditions.

ANALYSIS

This bill authorizes a new alternative treatment center for cannabis in the Hillsborough and Merrimack area of New Hampshire.

HB 174 - AS INTRODUCED

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Nineteen

AN ACT relative to alternative treatment center licenses.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Departmental Administration; Alternative Treatment Centers. Amend RSA 126-X:7, III to 2 read as follows:

III. If at any time after 2 years after the effective date of this section, fewer than [4] 5 alternative treatment centers hold valid registration certificates in New Hampshire, the department shall accept applications for a new alternative treatment center. The department shall accept applications for a new alternative treatment center in either Hillsborough or Merrimack county. No more than [4] 5 alternative treatment centers shall hold valid registration certificates at one time.

9 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
