The bill creates a commission made up of stake holders from the NH alcohol manufacturing industry and state departments to develop a plan to promote the growing interest, from both instate and out-of-state tourists, in the New Hampshire small businesses that produce beer, wine, and spirits, and offer tours and tasting at their facilities. The commission will study ways to help tourists find these businesses, including through highway signage, maps, and advertising plans. The amendment adds two members and a requirement for the commission to develop a mechanism to allow farm-to-table dinners held at a location without an alcohol license to offer local alcohol products as part of the event.

The amendment adds two members and a requirement for the commission to develop a mechanism to allow farm-to-table dinners held at a location without an alcohol license to offer local alcohol products as part of the event. Vote 20-0.

HB 348, relative to procedures for condominiums with 25 or fewer residential units. OUGHT TO PASS. This bill reduces the meeting requirements for smaller condominium associations. These associations, some as small as two units, generally operated less formally than large associations, and requiring them to operate like a big development with hundreds of units and paid staff imposes an undue burden. Nothing in the bill prohibits an association from having stricter meeting requirements in its operating documents.

The bill also requires associations to have a master insurance policy to cover common areas, and spells out who is responsible if tamage occurs and no insurance is in place. Vote 20-0.

HB 598 establishing a commission to study beer and wine agritourism. OUGHT TO PASS WITH AMENDMENT. The bill creates a commission made up of stakeholders from the alcohol industry and state departments to develop a plan promoting the growing interest from both in-state and out-of-state tourists in the New Hampshire small businesses that produce beer, wine, and spirits, and offer tours and tastings at their facilities. The commission will study ways to help tourists find these businesses, including highway signage, maps, and advertising plans. The commission will also develop a mechanism to allow farm-to-table dinners held at a location without an alcohol license to offer local alcohol products as part of the event. Vote 20-0.

HB 309, relative to procedure for foreclosure of a mortgage. OUGHT TO PASS WITH AMENDMENT. This bill changes the notice requirements if a mortgage exercises its power of foreclosure under the mortgage contract. The notice must be served by the sheriff in the county where the property resides, rather than by mail. The bill also modifies the currently-existing process by which a mortgagor can stop a foreclosure process, allowing them to file a complaint, rather than a petition, with the court. Vote 20-0.

HB 460-FN, relative to responsibility of the consumer protection and antitrust bureau over condominium disputes. INEXPEDIENT TO LEGISLATE. This bill would require the Attorney General's Consumer Protection unit to resolve complaints from condominium unit owners through arbitration, investigation, cease-and-desist orders, or other means. While the committee recognizes that there are a significant number of complaints lodged each year, the Consumer Protection unit is a small group with a large set of responsibilities, and would be overwhelmed by the volume and complexity of this task. The committee believes that other avenues to solve these problems should be sought. Vote 20-0.

HB 585, relative to the procedure for mortgage foredosure. INEXPEDIENT TO LEGISLATE. This bill would automatically void foreclosure sales under certain circumstances, which would typically involve fraud. The committee felt that any foreclosure action where fraud was a concern should be a handled by a court, so due consideration would be given to the issues and the rights of each party. Vote 20-0.

HB 664-FN, relative to vehicle repair standards. MAJORITY OUGHT TO PASS WITH AMENDMENT. This bill requires automobile insurance companies to pay for the cost of accident repairs that follow the manufacturer's recommendations for repair processes. This bill was created after a study committee last year found that there was a serious concern that insurance companies were not always willing to pay for diagnostic scans and other procedures which ensure that the embedded electronics and mechanical systems in modern vehicles that provide functions such as driver assistance and increase safe operation are returned to pre-loss functionality after a crash. Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Commission on New Hampshire Beer and Wine Agritourism. Amend RSA 425 2 by inserting after section 2-a the following new section: 425:2-b Commission on New Hampshire Beer and Wine Agritourism. 3 4 There is established a commission to study beer and wine agritourism in New 5 Hampshire. The members of the commission shall be as follows: 6 (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the 7 house of representatives. 8 (b) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate. 9 (c) The commissioner of the department of agriculture, markets, and foods, or designee. 10 (d) The liquor commissioner, or designee. (e) The commissioner of the department of transportation, or designee. 11 12 (f) The director of the division of travel and tourism development, or designee. 13 (g) One representative from the New Hampshire Winery Association, appointed by the 14 association. 15 (h) One representative from the New Hampshire Brewers' Association, appointed by the 16 association. 17 (i) Two members of the general public, appointed by the governor. 18 II. Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when 19 attending to the duties of the commission. 20

III. The commission shall develop a plan for New Hampshire beer and wine agritourism, including beer and wine trails with signage along New Hampshire highways, changes to liquor commission laws and rules that would enhance tourist experiences at New Hampshire wineries and breweries, and coordination of beer and wine agritourism marketing efforts among the department of agriculture, markets, and food, the division of travel and tourism development, the department of transportation, and wine and beer producer associations.

IV. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the commission shall be held within 30 days of the effective date of this section. Seven members of the commission shall constitute a quorum. The commission shall hold public meetings at least once per month and shall solicit and consider from interested parties testimony, documents, and other information pertaining to the commission's work.
