Question - Rep. Weber: We had this same committee operating in the last biennium. Is this a different initiative? Has this already been studied adequately?

Answer - The subject matter is different from SB 115 and what was studied last year.

Question - Rep. Schapiro: The bill refers to business process alignment. Does information system interoperability refer to business information or to clinical information?

Answer - Defers.

Deputy Commissioner Thomas Pristow, Department of Health and Human Services – Supports the bill. The bill is somewhat of a continuation of last year's committee. The department is a monolith of silos. Last year, the committee began to integrate the silos for sharing information. The Integrated Delivery Networks were set up a few years ago. The committee helped to bring people in from across the state to break down silos externally across the state as well as internally, within the department. Looked at un-duplicated individuals to make sure they get the necessary services. The bill addresses information technology issues also.

Question - Rep. Pearson: To what degree are computer systems not talking to each other affecting interoperability?

Answer - Integration is further along today. The department is working to build systems that are up to date. We don't want to duplicate taxpayer dollars.

Question - Rep. Knirk: Is this sharing of clinical and financial information?

Answer - There is information sharing now but there are hiccups dealing with privacy. At this point we have just been looking at business alignment to make sure citizens are not being duplicated in the process.

Question - Rep. Knirk: Could this be a pilot program?

Answer - That is the goal, to get all of the providers to want to participate.

Question - Rep. Knirk: Is it the companies that do not allow interoperability?

Answer - Companies are conservative for legal purposes.

Question - Rep. Guthrie: What is this committee going to do to assist you with your work?

Answer - If this goes forward I'd meet with Senator Kahn to see what agenda he wants and look at what the department can do to align with that agenda. The committee has the ability to bring

people in, which is probably the biggest thing the committee can do. The forum is a respected forum. The report at the end will convey what we did and whether there is legislation that comes from that or not.

Question - Rep. Nelson: Is this problem unique to NH?

Answer - He was a Department of Health and Human Services director in three other states and no other states have figured this out. It is a process. The issue is that people do not want to do this. They just need to be shown that the value is worth the effort.

Question - Rep. Campion: Asks for an example of business systems data that you are seeking to integrate?

Answer - Service array.

Question - Rep. Campion: Is that tied to an individual provider and an individual client? Answer: We have to start at the aggregate level until we get some of the laws changed to move to the individual level.

Question - Rep. Guthrie: Will it be a disadvantage to what you have already accomplished with the former committee by adding additional goals? Should SB 176 be left alone? Or is there some value in adding the commission in SB 115?

Question - Rep. Weber: Would it be a good idea to combine both initiatives? It seems that they are different in scope and intent.

Question - Rep. Ticehurst: Does the department have the authority and ability to gather this information about services the state provides?

Answer - Information will be provided.

Question - Rep. Snow: Would this hinder the ability of the IDNs to do their work?

Answer - This would enhance the ability of the IDNs to communicate.

Question - Rep. Campion: Is the intent to give the committee access to information about services not paid for by the state? My understanding is that there would be no right to that information.



Chair calls the hearing on HB 176 to order at 10:31 am

Sen. Jay Kahn, prime sponsor - Following up on a study committee on Mental Health and Human Services, 2016-17. House members, Pat Long, Jess Edwards also served on the Study committee. Use business process alignments with interservice delivery could we reduce cost? The integrated delivery network (IDN) launched in the last 3-years to align regionally mental health and health services. As we progressed through the process we found processes that will reduce the amount of registrations that will be needed. This committee is designed to look at these integrated services and determine if there are efficiencies in the system that can be implemented.

Q: Chairman Butler - What is the senate bill #?

A: We'll get it.

Q: Why is state oversight required for the IDNs?

A: Two ways:

- 1. There may be barriers that we can reduce, House HHS is looking at are there HIPPA compliant clinicians that need to collaborate to provide sufficient services in regard to health and mental health.
- 2. Relative to more wrap around services. These services need to be integrated and have been siloed in the past; this committee will work to look at funding needs and legislative needs and priorities.

Q: Were the Department of HHS and other stakeholder's part of the study last time around?

A: Yes. And their participation was critical to the operability of the changes implemented.

Q: Do you see synergy between HB115 and this bill? **A:** I don't know the specifics of HB 115.

Q: Rep. Richard Abel - Since the State of NH has invested so much in independent managed care companies that impact mental health care, is your vision that this study committee also look at this?

A: This committee did not look at the efficiencies of managed care networks. I don't know if down the road the Department would want to look at managed care. There was a conversation about how many individuals could one practitioner provide services? The greater integration of the programs may provide greater access to managed care.

Q: Rep. John Potucek - Would it be a good thing to add into the contracts? **A:** Not all social service agencies are under contract. That's why the IDN's are so important. Would it be valuable to modify the NHD of HHS contacts to ensure a certain amounts of information on the front end? So the question has been asked and the Dept. Commissioner can respond.

Chairman Butler - Thank you.

Rep. Edwards, co sponsor - Supports.

Q: Chairman Butler — Could you talk on the difference between the two bills, HB 115 and HB 176.

A: I have a background in IT systems. I was on Health & Human Services last year.

This bill is a continuation of a study committee that we have spent a good deal of time on.

- a. Mental Health services in NH we have a need for interoperationability. (lots of messy stuff happening, legacy software created difference systems i.e. in eligibility system.
- b. We needed to look at inter-operability of operations not only within the state but also between the state and others. i.e. effective sharing of medical records—integrate the MCI (Master Client Index) standard.

Q: Chairman Butler - How are these two bills different enough to have both? **A:** HB 115 is looking at the whole environment, HB 176 is looking at a specific issue.

Q: You said the last study committee did add value, and you think more study would be useful?

A: Yes. And I am usually a cynical individual. But the feedback I receive from the boots on the ground is that the legislature really did add value. I think it's valuable to continue the study.

Thomas Pristow, Dept. Commissioner of NH Dept. of HHS - Supports. SB 147 is the previous senate bill that the study committee came out of that this bill hopes to continue the progress.

Although improvements were made, none of the issues of the past study committee were totally completed, there is still some more work that needs doing.

- a. Master Client Index additional work on that
- b. Capital Funding Implementation of an Enterprise Data Analytics Platform in HB2 by Gov. Sununu not sure what will happen with that request. Need to figure out how we provide data to all constituent parts of the integrated health delivery system? The value this study committee brings, gives the status

necessary to bring divergent groups together, and get the work done.

Administer - Supports. This study committee supports the needs of practitioners and the people getting care from the system. This will allow us to report back to the state regarding quality of care measurement systems. This is a demonstration project. We are trying to build an infrastructure that we can test and improve as we are piloting and testing – getting prompt feedback and determine best practices and what works in the best interest of NH citizens. We hope to bring standardization across the state. Managed Care did participate in a few of the meetings of the last study committee. We are trying to study the changes desired in contracting. You may decide that this is an area for further study.

Q: Is it your intention that IDN's will be primarily looked at from the provider side of the equation? And what about HIPPA

A: Mr. Pristow - It's not just IND's - as you know we created a wheel and spoke model for the beginning of the larger system.

A: Ms.Cappuccino - Don't you have direct confidential messaging between providers. The infrastructure is there for the communication of HIPPA protected information. Important to look at where we are in alignment, and were we can improve communication from those receiving care.

Q: Rep. Warden - How many IVM's and how many patients in NH?
A: Ms. Cappuccino - NH obtained a Medicaid waiver for access to services to patients. This is not a grant. 7 IBN's – geographically distinguished – at least 15,000 in each. Not just Medicaid recipients served, 178,000 individuals served.

Q: Rep. Butler - The bill takes effect on Jan 2020. What about as soon as passed?

A: Mr.Pristow - We would be open to an earlier date.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Nineteen

AN ACT

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establishing a committee to study mental health and human service business process alignment and information system interoperability.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study mental health and human 2 service business process alignment and information system interoperability.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
 - (b) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
 - II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the committee.
 - 3 Duties.
 - I. The committee shall study mental health and human service business process alignment and information system interoperability. The committee's study shall include, but not be limited to, methods to improve access to services, reduce duplicative effort, and integrate primary care mental health and substance use treatment systems.
 - II. The committee may solicit information from any person or entity the committee deems relevant to its study including, but not limited to, the department of health and human services, the insurance department, community mental health programs, and the department of information technology.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library, on or before November 1, 2020.
 - 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2020.
