#### Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Timothy Lang

Belknap – District 4

- Representative Lang introduced HB 162 on behalf of the prime sponsor, Representative Howard Pearl.
- HB 162 is a housekeeping bill that repeals statute that is no longer enforced by the NH Division of Forests and Lands within the NH Department of Natural and Cultural Resources.
- HB 162 passed the House Resources, Recreation, and Development Committee with a 19-0 vote on the consent calendar. The bill passed on a voice vote on the House floor.
- Senator Giuda asked if Representative Lang's tie was a Jerry Garcia tie.
  - o Representative Lang said it was a Jerry Garcia tie. His children give him a Jerry Garcia tie every Father's Day, Christmas, and birthday.

Curtis Barry - provided written testimony

Lobbyist, Barry Government Relations, representing the NH Retail Lumber Association (NHRLA)

- In doing research for the NHRLA, Mr. Barry reached out to various parties about RSA 347:
  - o Jasen Stock, the Executive Director of the NH Timberland Owners Association, asked his members and found no one had any experience with the statute.
  - The NH Division of Forests and Lands had no use of the statute.
  - o The NH Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food had no use of the state.
- RSA 347 is an unenforced area of statute that creates requirements and penalties for violations of the statute. Therefore, it makes sense to repeal it.
  - o HB 162 would repeal provisions covering the inspection of timber, which includes lumber and

- shingles, that are outdated and no longer apply to the industry or how materials are measured, graded, or any other current industry standard.
- Repealing the statute would not reduce the safety, inspection, or quality of materials produced or sold in NH. In fact, NH businesses cannot meet the inapplicable standards found in the current statute.
- The agencies and organizations that oversee the grading of timber, dimensional lumber, and shingles are constantly upgrading their standards to ensure that products are safe and meet stringent requirements to be graded and sold. This is a necessity in order to keep up with new technology introduced into the industry. RSA 347 has arcane inspection rules that are a relic of the past.

#### Jason Stock

Executive Director, NH Timberland Owners Association (NHTOA)

- Reiterated earlier testimony in support of HB 162.
- RSA 347 makes reference to cullers, staves, and shingles, which used to be large components of New Hampshire's economy, but are no longer.
- Senator Giuda asked if the NHTOA was in support of putting RSA 347 into the waste stream of legislative history.
  - o Mr. Stock said NHTOA was in support of repealing RSA 347.

The New Hampshire Retail Lumber Association (NHRLA) strongly supports House Bill 162, repealing the requirement for the inspection of timber.

NHRLA represents independently-owned lumber and building material suppliers and other associated businesses, including wholesalers, manufacturers, and distributors. Our members are often family-owned businesses and generational. These businesses pride themselves on providing quality and safe materials that are graded by the proper agencies and organization to meet or exceed all accepted industry standards.

House Bill 162 would repeal provisions covering the inspection of timber, which includes lumber and shingles, that are outdated and no longer apply to the industry or how materials are measured, graded, or any other current industry standard.

Repealing this statue would in no way reduce the safety, inspection, or quality of materials produced or sold in New Hampshire. In fact, to meet the safety and standards required for materials produced and sold today, New Hampshire businesses cannot meet the inapplicable standards found in the current statute.

The agencies and organizations that oversee the grading of timber, dimensional lumber, and shingles are constantly upgrading their standards to ensure that products are safe and meet stringent requirements to be graded and sold. This has become a necessity to keep up with new technology being introduced to the industry and makes these arcane inspection rules nothing more than a relic of the past.

It is for the above stated reasons that NHRLA strongly supports this legislation.

The NHRLA has 67 member companies and represents independent lumber and building material dealers, manufactures, wholesalers, distributors, and other associated businesses in the state of New Hampshire. The industry employs more than 17,000 New Hampshire residents with nearly \$823 million in annual wages.
