ANALYSIS

This bill repeals the effective date of the removal of the members of the house of representatives and the senate from the university system of New Hampshire board of trustees resulting in the house and senate members remaining on the board of trustees as voting members.

Bill Analysis: This bill repeals the effective date of the removal of the members of the house of representatives and the senate from the university system of New Hampshire board of trustees resulting in the house and senate members remaining on the board of trustees as voting members.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Ron Rogers

- This bill would remove the expiration date for the two legislative positions on the Board of Trustees and would result in the two positions being indefinite.
- The trustees have not taken a position this bill and will refer to the legislature.
- Senator Kahn asked how many members are on the Board of Trustees. Mr. Rogers answered that there are 29 members – two legislative members, the Governor, the Commissioner of Agriculture, the Commissioner of Education, 5 members from the University system, 2 students, 7 alumni, and 10 members nominated by the Governor and Executive Council.
- Senator Kahn asked how long the two legislative positions have been included on the Board of Trustees. Mr. Rogers replied that the legislative positions were created in either 2015 or 2016.
- Senator Kahn asked if it is clear in statute that the Senate President or their designee are voting members of the board. Mr. Rogers replied that it is very clear.
- Senator Starr asked if this bill is concerning the legislators' voting rights. Mr. Rogers answered that in the previous session the bill was regarding their voting rights, but all this bill does it remove the sunset date for their seats on the Board of Trustees.
- Senator Kahn asked which RSA this bill concerns. Mr. Rogers stated RSA 187: A 13
- Senator Dietsch asked if Mr. Rogers believes that having legislative representation is a good idea. Mr. Rogers answered that previously legislative members have been very helpful as they bring differing perspectives and additional wisdom.
